Wellness and Independence through Nutrition

Being unable to purchase adequate food (food insecurity) is correlated with poor health outcomes. Participation in the SNAP Outreach Program can help lowans who are mid-life and older and "at-risk" for malnutrition and/or food insecurity, overcome the financial barriers of purchasing nutrient-rich foods that are needed to help them improve and/or maintain their health. However, about 60% of adults ages 65 years and older are eligible for SNAP but are not enrolled (USDA Food and Nutrition Service).

"Wellness and Independence through Nutrition" (WIN) is an outreach program funded through the United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA's) SNAP program. It is designed to:

- Promote SNAP outreach efforts toward lowans ages 50 years and older.
- Increase awareness of SNAP and how it can help maintain good health and independence for mid-life and adults ages 50 years and older.
- Increase the number of eligible lowans ages 50 years and older applying for SNAP.

Indirect outreach includes distribution of the WIN Guide, WIN prescription pads, and WIN bookmarks. Also available is a WIN video and display set. Direct outreach features a virtual presentation as well as three face-to-face presentations: WIN Bingo, Gardening: How to Grow Your Wallet, and What's in Your Grocery Cart? A WIN discussion points guide is available to use with one-on-one interactions.

In 2023-2024 WIN outreach will be delivered in Jackson, Clinton, Scott, Dubuque, and Linn counties in Regions 11, 12, and 20. Please contact Amber Matthiesen, Vera Stokes, or Phyllis Zalenski, local WIN managers, for more information.
