Strong Couples Project Pilot

Strong Couples Project was piloted across North Central Region states in 2023. This project is based with Illinois Extension and was expanded to the other states in the North Central Region that were interested this year.

The Strong Couples Project is an online relationship education project that focuses on helping couples improve communication, connection, intimacy and strengthening their relationship. The project has been available at no cost to the couples and the only requirement for couples to participate has been that the couple must be married, engaged, or living together for at least six months.

Couples complete a series of six online sessions within the evidence-based ePREP ® program. These online sessions are supplemented with five, 20-minute coaching calls over Zoom. During the coaching calls participants strengthen their skills that are learned during the online sessions. Participants had the opportunity to complete three surveys throughout the time of the project at pre-determined stages.

lowa had three coaches receive training in this pilot phase, Dr. Anthony Santiago, Ryan Stuart, and Danielle Day. Coaches received training in fall 2022. Marketing and coaching began in spring 2023. To date, around 300 couples responded to marketing for strong couples and about one-third of the couples enrolled in the project across the six North Central Region states that participated.

lowa couples that completed the program were from counties across the state and all shared that they found value in the program, taking it for different reasons and at different stages of their relationships. All lowa couples that fully completed the program highly recommended the program. In the couples that I coached all had various interactions with extension programming, with some this was their first interaction, with others this was their first Human Sciences program, for others they were very familiar with our programming and had participated in multiple programming opportunities. Program pilots are another way we engage with lowans to meet their needs.
