The Davis County Fair provided the opportunity for youth to demonstrate what they had learned through their 4-H project




work over the past year.

Working toward Recovery

As our state works toward recovery, ISU Extension and Outreach Davis County has been expanding educational opportunities for youth. Davis County Extension has partnered with the Bloomfield Public Library to offer STEM backpacks to local youth. These backpacks include a variety of educational opportunities that families are able to check out. We also partnered with the library to offer two programs this summer where we did art projects and science experiments with youth.

readings to educate youth about agriculture and how it relates to their lives.

In May, Davis County Extension partnered with Davis County Elementary to bring a chick hatching unit to the Kindergarten classes. During the weekly programs, extension staff read books, taught about chick development and care, candled eggs, and helped the students prepare a home for their chicks. The chick hatching project was enjoyed by all, and we look forward to working with a new group of students and chicks in the spring!

Looking ahead to 2022, ISU Extension and Outreach Davis County will continue to provide educational opportunities to youth including Soccer for Success in March, the On Their Own and Okay program in May, and a Strawberry Jam making workshop in June.
