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

SERVING THE PEOPLE OF IDA COUNTY

In 2022, ISU Extension and Outreach Ida County continued to support lowans in reviving the lowa economy, including the farm economy. Farmland is the limited resources for agricultural producers in lowa, and 62.4% of Ida agricultural land is under some form of rental arrangement. With an aging landowner population and issues related to farmland changing year after year, leasing programs and the educational materials used in these programs are of great value to the clientele in our county and the landowners scattered across the country. In 2022, we hosted one of 74 locations for Farmland Leasing and Management workshops. As a result, small businesses, entrepreneurs, agribusinesses, landowners, and farmers increased their knowledge on leasing trends, legal issues, and methods for determining cash rental rates and creating more resilient leasing arrangements.





QuickBooks Training a Success!

Ida County along with the other counties in the region partnered with Small Business Development Center (SBDC) to host a QuickBooks training on May 19th in Storm Lake. The four-hour program provided the 18 participants an opportunity to learn new features of QuickBooks and to ask questions to the SBDC instructors.
