K-12 Youth Outreach

Through partnerships with amazing organizations within our community we are able to maximize our involvement with youth by offering numerous programs and fun educational activities both in and out of the classrooms. Kids learn about many facets of agriculture ranging from pumpkin facts, bread baking, safety around livestock, and healthy choices and lifestyles. We also strive to enhance the relationships between different age groups of our youth by inviting high school students to serve as camp counselors during our day long science camp offered to 5th graders. Campers, counselors, teachers and numerous volunteers spend time at Pony Creek Park learning about predators and prey, recycling, using newspapers to make their own paper, gazing at the night stars and planets with the local Astronomy Club, and learning about all aspects of nature from the Conservation Department and DNR. Our counselors jump at the opportunity to help because they remember the impact 5th grade science camp had on them.

4-H County Council also plays a large role in encouraging and influencing younger youth in the county by planning youth activities, judging clover kids projects at the fair, and speaking about 4-H at schools during 4-H week.
