A note from Aubrey Sholty, County Youth Coordinator:

Highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI)

The Iowa Department of Ag and Land Stewardship along with the Iowa Poultry Association announced an order suspending all live bird exhibitions at fairs and other gatherings due to highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI). The order is effective immediately for a minimum of 30 days, and until 30 days has passed without a positive case of a new infection in the state of Iowa. Market Sheep & Goat Weigh-In is **April 30 from 10:00-noon** at the Crawford County Fair Grounds. Retinal Imaging will done for those that plan to show 4-H at the Iowa State Fair. If you plan to show market sheep or goats you will need to attend on this day or make arrangements to attend another counties weigh-in.

May 15 ID Deadline



These are NOT your entries for the fair. All livestock must be identified in 4HOnline 2.0 by May 15 (paper copy for FFA members) for eligibility to exhibit at the Crawford County Fair and the Iowa State Fair with the exception of bucket bottle, poultry and rabbits for the Crawford County Fair. These species have until July 1. Market Beef ID's had to be made by February 1. State Fair Swine DNA Envelopes must be turned into the extension office by May 15.

FairEntry is where **ALL** exhibitors (4-H & FFA) make their entries for the fair (static, clothing/ communications, livestock and reserve stalls/pens.)

FairEntry will open on June 1 and close on July 1. To be eligible to show at the Crawford County Fair youth must be a member is good standing, have their animals ID'd in 4-H Online, entered in FairEntry and completed their YQCA by July 1.

All 4-H Livestock & Horticulture State Fair Entries must be entered into FairEntry by July 1. If you are an FFA member and plan to show at the Iowa State Fair, you will need to get with your advisor.





4-H members exhibiting livestock at both county fairs and Iowa State Fair in beef, dairy, meat goat, poultry, rabbit, sheep, or swine are required to be certified. YQCA has a new website this year. Youth who have a current valid certification WILL need to login to the old website and save a copy of their certificate. All 4-H & FFA members must create a new account. The Crawford County YQCA deadline is July 1 and the extension office MUST have a copy of your certificate. You will also be prompted to enter you certificate number in FairEntry when you make your entries, entries will not be approved until your YQCA is completed.



	To be a member in good standing, you must be enrolled/re-enrolled in 4-H Online 2.0 by January 1. You also must go to at least four club meetings to be able to show at ANY fair. https://v2.4honline.com/										
	Are ALL your entries identified in 4-H Online 2.0 prior to May 15?										
	All livestock must be identified in 4HOnline 2.0 by May 15 (paper copy for FFA members) for eligibility to exhibit at the Crawford County Fair and the lowa State Fair. https://v2.4honline.com/										
	Are all your entries entered in FairEntry prior to July 1?										
	ALL exhibitors (4-H & FFA) must have their static, clothing, communication, pets and livestock entered in FairEntry prior to July 1. https://fairentry.com/										
	Have you completed your YQCA prior to July 1 and submitted										
	a copy to the Crawford County Extension Office?

We have **Emma Lingle who has completed the 1st virtual 100-mile challenge** and she has received her medal. Still have to meet up with others for them to get their medals and pictures.

If you still have not completed the 1st challenge keep track of those miles till you reach the 100-mile milestone. Then you can move on to complete the 2nd challenge. Remember riding the miles is the easy part – keeping track of those miles is the HARD part.

We will have a 2nd Virtual 100 Mile Challenge that will start April 1st for those of you who completed the 1st challenge. The cost will be the same as last year \$10.

States' 4-H Summer Outbound programs provides American 4-H youth with the opportunity to travel to foreign countries for a cultural immersion experience. Outbound delegates live with volunteer host families and engage in experiential learning about a new way of life. Delegates experience aspects of daily life that allow them to more deeply understand both their host culture and their own culture.

Crawford County would like to congratulate our very own Crawford County 4-Her, Brigid Bonner! Brigid is the daughter of Brad and Shani Bonner. Bonner is currently in the 8th grade and this summer she will be traveling to South Korea for four weeks.

Bonner will participate in pre-departure orientations held in the US. She will be accompanied by adult chaperones who remain in-country to provide support during the exchange. Upon arrival to South Korea, Bonner will participate in an arrival orientation led by Korea 4-H, which includes an Introduction to Korean culture and instruction in basic language phrases. Bonner will have the opportunity to attend 4-H International Camp where she will meet other foreign delegates and participate in cultural exchange activities. The program will conclude with a
