Record Books

The purpose of 4-H record keeping is to teach how to keep records, which is an important life skill. Record keeping is an ongoing process that does not end when the 4-H year ends.

Record books are **due no later than October 16th!** Record book materials can be found online at **https://www.extension.iastate.edu/crawford/4h** or **https://www.extension.iastate.edu/4h/record-keeping**.

Every record book that is turned in MUST have a member application for 4-H awards and member application for special 4-H awards (filled out by the 4-H member, books that don't have these won't be considered for awards). Record books should also have one yearly summary, and the correct project record

sheets for each project. It is also a good idea to include the club program, pictures, newspaper clippings,

County Council

Calling all 9th-12th grade 4-H members!

Senior 4-H members (grades 9-12) in Crawford County are encouraged to apply to be a member of County Council. County Council is designed to develop leadership skills in its members by planning, organizing, and running different events throughout the year as well as participating in leadership retreats. Members assist with National 4-H Week, Awards Banquet, select fair events, livestock weigh-ins, and other events as needed. Youth will have the hands-on opportunity to plan county wide events that they feel would benefit the county during any time of the year. Meeting dates and times will be set once members are selected to best work with everyone's schedules. Applications are available and due to the Extension Office no later than **October 1.**
