

4-H/FFA County Market Beef Animal ID's

If you are planning to exhibit a market beef animal, you MUST have weighed it in on Wednesday, December 29 or made arrangements to attend another counties weigh-in.

Now that you have weighed in you MUST enter your weights and ID's on 4-H Online by February 1st. If there is a mistake, we must know beforehand. We can not make changes in 4-H Online after February 1st. If you are showing FFA you must have all paper ID forms turned into the extension office by February 1st.

Smithfield will be offering the Smithfield Swine Production Class again this year. This will be the third year for this class and we are very excited to be offering it again! A little background about this class is below.

Smithfield hog production has stepped up to help fund this class as they will provide each exhibitor that is interested with four hogs around seventy-five pounds. Pigs will be available around March or April at fifty dollars a piece from their source of pigs.

The structure of the program would be centered around more of the day to day activities with the kids getting to bring the pigs to the fair. These pigs would show in a separate class of just these hogs and be judged on the uniformity of the group as well as the records that are kept. The day to day activities would be the daily care of the hogs and record keeping. Each exhibitor would need to keep track of the feed, medications, daily observations of the pigs and visitors to the farm. Each exhibitor would also need to conduct a line of separation within the guidelines of the secure pork act and pass a mock site assessment and common swine audit performed by a certified PQA plus advisor. Smithfield Swine Project Agreement

2022 Crawford County Fair 4-H Project

For each participant ISU Extension and Outreach, Crawford County will:

- Provide liability coverage for participants and approved 4-H volunteers from LMC Insurance for the duration of the swine project
- 2. Provide an educational experience concurrent with research- based curriculum from Iowa State University Extension and Outreach, USDA guidelines, PQA and YQCA guidelines.
- 3. Coordinate pickup location and time.

For each participant Smithfield will:

- 1. Provide a project for youth at a reasonable cost and a well-rounded education experience.
- 2. Coordinate pickup location and time.

The 4-H participant will:

- 1. Pay \$50 per pig for four pigs for a total of \$200, Sign agreement along with parent/guardian stating their intent to carry out the project to completion and follow the below criteria.
 - a. Keep daily record keeping of feed, medications, visitors, daily observations of the pigs.
 - b. Conduct a line of separation for biosecurity.
 - c. Pass a mock site assessment.
- Youth in 4-H must attend the mandatory education sessions, meet biosecurity expectations, record-keeping, livestock entry process (FairEntry), and YQCA requirements or exhibitor will not be able to exhibit pigs.
- 3. Youth will be expected to care for and show their pigs at the 2020 Crawford County Fair Swine Show in a separate class based on uniformity of the pigs and record keeping.
- 4. Providing care at the fair includes but is not limited to:
 - a. Provide necessary feed pans
 - b. Provide cooling fan if needed
 - c. Feed, water and monitor pigs for stress
 - d. Maintain stall barn area in a clean and presentable fashion according to Crawford County 4-H herdsmanship standards listed in the fair book.
 - e. Turn in daily record keeping at the fair to be eligible for next year.
 - f. If the participant provides improper treatment of any livestock animal the 4-H'er will be ineligible to participate in the swine program and may be ineligible for 4-H participation in accordance to the 4-H Code of Ethics and County Youth committee and County Extension Council guidelines.
- 5. Do **NOT** feed paylean to the pigs.

Remember, to be a member in good standing, you must be re-enrolled in 4hOnline by January 1st. You also must go to at least four club meetings to be able to show at ANY fair.

If you have a sibling that is now able to join 4-H, simply log on to 4hOnline like usual and just click "Add a new Family Member". If they were in Clover Kids and already have a profile, simply reenroll them but make sure they have a 4-H club selected instead of Clover Kids under the participation tab.

Meat Goat

- Show breeding meat goat does by weight instead of age birthdate will be used to split does under 1 year of age and over 1 year, then weight used to split individual classes
- Split market meat goats into 2 divisions market wethers, market does
- Four divisions market wethers (lightweight, mediumweight, heavyweight); market does division cham pions will compete for overall Grand/Reserve Grand 4-H Market Meat Goat
- New Rule: Fitting will be allowed. Only the 4-H exhibitor, an immediate family member (limited to parent/ legal guardian, brother, sister, or step-sibling), or current lowa 4-H member are allowed to assist in fitting animals. Painting, powdering, dyeing and use of color agents is not allowed. Animals which show evidence of this will not be permitted into the show ring. Any meat goat is subject to wiping with a towel to check for color or coloring agents prior to entering the show ring or upon completion of a class. If a color or coloring agent rubs off an animal rubbed with either a towel or hand, that animal will be disqualified.

Poultry

Exhibitors will be requested to submit substitutions to Superintendent by Monday before the show – this allows for a more accurate show catalog and cage cards to be corrected

- Utilize 2-judge system for market swine
