ID Deadline Schedule

FEBRUARY 1: All market steers and market heifers must be owned and identified in 4-H Online by February 1. By the time of the weigh-in, the animal(s) must be cared for by the 4-H member. In addition to having an official 4-H tag and beginning weight collected, all lowa State Fair market beef must have retinal images collected. FFA must have paper copies turned in.

MAY 15: All other animals, with the exception of pets, poultry, and rabbits, must be owned and identified in 4-H Online by May 15. FFA must have paper copies turned in.

JULY 1: Rabbits must be identified by July 1 in 4-H Online. By the time of the weigh-in, the animal(s) must be cared for by the 4-H member. FFA must have paper copies turned in.

JULY 1 – YQCA Deadline, Crawford County Fair Entry Deadline & State Fair Entry Deadline

Entering Ear Tags in 4-H Online

When entering ear tags in 4-H online be sure to list all the digits on the tag.

Save the Date: Recognition Day

State 4-H Recognition is the process in which senior 4-H members in grades 9-12 can apply to be selected for special statewide opportunities such as awards and trips. The purpose of this event is to provide an avenue for youth recognition and to provide young people with an opportunity to practice and grow leadership, communications, and college and career readiness skills through application and interview activities.

State Project Area Awards- State project area awards are awarded to 4-H members who have demonstrated leadership, communication, and service through activities, events, and self-directed learning in a specific project area. Recipients will be provided with a \$100 prize (dependent on funding). Up to 50 project area awards will be presented to Iowa 4-H members in grades 9-12 at the time of application.

State 4-H Council- The State 4-H Council is a group of young people who serve as ambassadors for the Iowa 4-H program. This group of high school students works directly with Iowa 4-H Youth Development staff to represent 4-H across the state. They speak to local 4-H groups, present ideas to staff, and work in committees to plan the Iowa 4-H Youth Conference and 4-H members for 4-H campaign. 40 delegates in grades 10-11 at the time of application will be selected.

National 4-H Congress- National 4-H Congress is held the day after the Thanksgiving holiday through the following Tuesday in Atlanta, GA. National 4-H Congress is comparable to the "State 4-H Youth Conference," but on a national scale. The event includes dynamic keynote speakers, community service in the Atlanta area, workshops on leadership, cultural issues, and team building. 20 delegates in grades 9-11 at the time of application will be selected, dependent on funding.

State Recognition Day virtual interviews will be held March 18, and in-person interviews on campus on will be March 25.

Smithfield will be offering the Smithfield Swine Production Class again this year. This will be the fourth year for this class and we are very excited to be offering it again! A little background about this class is below.

Smithfield hog production has stepped up to help fund this class as they will provide each exhibitor that is interested with four hogs around seventyfive pounds. Pigs will be available around March or April at fifty dollars a piece from their source of pigs. .

The structure of the program would be centered around more of the day to day activities with the kids getting to bring the pigs to the fair. These pigs would show in a separate class of just these hogs and be judged on the uniformity of the group as well as the records that are kept. The day to day activities would be the daily care of the hogs and record keeping. Each exhibitor would need to keep track of the feed, medications, daily observations of the pigs and visitors to the farm. Each exhibitor would also need to conduct a line of separation within the guidelines of the secure pork act and pass a mock site assessment and common swine audit performed by a certified PQA plus advisor. Landus Scholarships

High school seniors pursuing a career in agriculture, life sciences, or an ag-related field are invited to apply for the Landus 2022-23 "Excellence in Agriculture" scholarship.

The "Excellence in Agriculture" scholarship program awards five \$2,000 scholarships for any accredited post-secondary program. Applications are available online at https://www.landus.ag/about-us/community/excellence-in-ag-scholarship-application.

Scholarship Requirements:

- 1. Applicant and/or parent must be a voting member, in good standing, of Land us.
- 2. Applicant must be a high school senior and graduate in the spring of the 2022/2023 school year.
- 3. Applicant must have a cumulative high school GPA of 2.5 or better on a 4.0 scale through his/her junior year.
- 4. Applicant must pursue a career in agriculture or enter an ag-related field of study at any accredited post-secondary school of his or her choice.
- 5. Dependents of directors and officers of Land us are not eligible to apply for these scholarships.
