The 4-H Career Pathways Academy is a 12-month immersive program for all lowa youth in grades 8-11 that provides pathways to college and career preparedness. The program will:

- Engage marginalized youth in research-based educational opportunities that promote skill development in preparation for higher educational pursuits and careers in technical fields of study.
- Provide hands-on workforce development training to build leadership, innovative thinking, and entrepreneurial skills. Connect youth to externship opportunities in their local communities statewide.
- Prepare youth for long-term academic and vocational success, civic engagement, employability and economic stability, as well as provide them with opportunities for belonging and overall wellbeing.

When: The 4-H Career Pathways Academy will be kicked off June 28-June 30, 2022 on the lowa State University Campus in Ames. Youth participants will continue engaging on a monthly basis in skill development, hands-on learning opportunities, and apprenticeships in their local communities.

These are NOT your entries for the fair. All livestock must be identified in 4HOnline 2.0 by May 15 (paper copy for FFA members) for eligibility to exhibit at the Crawford County Fair and the Iowa State Fair with the exception of bucket bottle, poultry and rabbits for the Crawford County Fair. These species have until July 1. Market Beef ID's had to be made by February 1. State Fair Swine DNA Envelopes must be turned into the extension office by May 13. https://v2.4honline.com

FairEntry



FairEntry is where **ALL** exhibitors (4-H & FFA) make their entries for the fair (static, clothing/ communications, livestock and reserve stalls/pens.) **FairEntry will open on June 1 and close on July 1.** To be eligible to show at the Crawford County Fair youth must be a member is good standing, have their animals ID'd in 4-H Online, entered in FairEntry and completed their YQCA by July 1. **All 4-H Livestock & Horticulture State Fair Entries must be entered into FairEntry by July 1.** https://fairentry.com

YQCA

4-H members exhibiting livestock at both county fairs and lowa State Fair in beef, dairy, meat goat, poultry, rabbit, sheep, or swine are required to be certified. YQCA has a new website this year. All 4-H & FFA members must create a new account. The Crawford County YQCA deadline is July 1 and the extension office MUST have a copy of your certificate. You will also be prompted to enter you certificate number in FairEntry when you make your entries, entries will not be approved until your YQCA is completed. https://yqcaprogram.org/

Confused about the steps that need to be to done in order to exhibit at the Crawford County Fair? Follow this checklist to see if you have completed all the necessary steps.

4-Her's-Are you a member in good standing?					
To be a member in good standing, you must be enrolled/re-enrolled in 4-H Online 2.0 by January 1. You also must go to at least four club meetings to be able to show at ANY fair. https://v2.4honline.com/					
Are ALL your entries identified in 4-H Online 2.0 prior to May 15?					
All livestock must be identified in 4HOnline 2.0 by May 15 (paper copy for FFA members) for eligibility to exhibit at the Crawford County Fair and the Iowa State Fair. https://v2.4honline.com/					
Are all your entries entered in FairEntry prior to July 1?					
ALL exhibitors (4-H & FFA) must have their static, clothing, communication, pets and livestock entered in FairEntry prior to July 1. https://fairentry.com/					
Have you completed your YQCA prior to July 1 and submitted a copy to the Crawford County Extension Office?					
4-H & FFA members exhibiting livestock at both county fairs and Iowa State Fair in beef, dairy, meat goat, poultry, rabbit, sheep, or swine are required to be certified. http://yqcaprogram.org/

Highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI)

The lowa Department of Ag and Land Stewardship along with the lowa Poultry Association announced an order suspending all live bird exhibitions at fairs and other gatherings due to highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI). The order is effective immediately for a minimum of 30 days, and until 30 days has passed without a positive case of a new infection in the state of lowa.

In regards to the **lowa State Fair 4-H Market Broiler show, those entries are due May 1st via Fair Entry.** We will continue to proceed with opening up entry and will monitor the situation if entry refunds need to be issued as we move ahead in the coming months.

Broilers

If there is enough interest we will proceed with broiler orders. If we can not have a poultry show at the fair there will be an alternative way for youth to showcase their exhibits. Dog Obedience will begin on May 25 at 7:00 p.m. at the fairgrounds and will go through July 13. The dog show will be Sunday, July 17 at 1:00 p.m. This is a GREAT opportunity to teach your dog some basic skills and even master some more challenging ones!

Horse Superintendent Update

If you still have not completed the 1st challenge keep track of those miles till you reach the 100-mile milestone. Then you can move on to complete the 2nd challenge. Remember riding the miles is the easy part – keeping track of those miles is the HARD part. We will have a 2nd Virtual 100 Mile Challenge that will start April 1st for those of you who completed the 1st challenge. The cost will be the same as last year \$10. Reminder: Please take the time to get out those helmets, clean them up and size them to your head for a proper fit BEFORE workshops start. Figure out different ways to have your hair when wearing the helmets, this will cut down time with "messing" with it and leave more time with your horse.

Workshops will start Thursday May 5th start time for the 1st session will be 5pm – 7:00pm, discussion will be 7:00pm to 7:30pm approximately, and then the 2nd session will be from 7:30pm to 9:30pm. Having 2 sessions will limit the number of horses in the arena at one time. Then the last 3 clinics there will only be 1 session since fair is right around the corner. Remember if you come late, it is your responsibility to join the group as soon as you are ready. If you are not able to come, please let me know and it will be YOUR responsibility to reach out to me to see what you missed. These workshops will be a progressive style and will build on skills we learn or work on the previous weeks' clinics.

Clover Kids Static Judging at the Crawford County Fair

Come to the Crawford County Fair on Monday, July 18 from 9:00-AM 3:00 PM to have your exhibits judged and displayed for the fair! Clover Kids can bring up to 5 exhibits in any of the following categories: Photography, Colored Pictures, Arts and Crafts, Food and Nutrition, Woodworking, Horticulture, or Sewing. The judging will take place at the first United Methodist Church in Denison and projects will be displayed in the exhibit building.

Clover Kids Stuffed Animal Show

To prepare for showing live animals for when youth are in 4-H, Clover Kids will have the opportunity to bring their favorite stuffed animal to show on Sunday, July 24 at 1:00 PM at the Crawford County Fairgrounds exhibit building.

Clover Kids Exhibiting Livestock

Members of the lowa 4-H Clover Kids program may exhibit or showcase their work in a noncompetitive event or activity. All Clover Kids animal exhibitions must be cooperative and not competitive. Clover Kids are not eligible to receive premium funds as a result of exhibition. Clover Kids may receive participatory ribbons, but may not receive regular competitive purple, blue, red, or white 4-H fair/exhibit ribbons.

Developmentally-appropriate small animal exhibits for children in grades K-3 include **pets**, **rabbits**, **poultry**, **sheep**, **goats**, **and bucket bottle projects (calf**, **sheep and goat)**. Safety requirements for all calf, sheep and goat livestock species are as follows:

- Animal must remain on a halter at all times.
- Animal must be born in the calendar year of the show Animal species specifically excluded from K-3 exhibition
 opportunities are swine, equine, camelids (Ilama and alpaca), beef (other than bucket bottle), and dairy (other
 than bucket bottle).
