

#### **Member in Good Standing**

Remember, to be a member in good standing, you must be re-enrolled in 4-H Online by February 1st. You also must go to at least four club meetings to be able to show at ANY fair.

If you have a sibling that is now able to join 4-H, simply log on to 4hOnline like usual and just click "Add a new Family Member". If they were in Clover Kids and already have a profile, simply reenroll them but make sure they have a 4-H club selected instead of Clover Kids under the participation tab.

For new families that are wanting to join 4-H, simply have them call the Extension Office or stop by so we can help them set up an account and get information needed for new 4-H members.

#### **YQCA**

If you plan to exhibit livestock (beef, goats, poultry, rabbit, sheep and/or swine) at any show or fair you need to complete online YQCA training (FSQA is no longer accepted).

There is a \$12 fee to complete this training. The Crawford County Extension Office will cover the cost to those that sell \$250 worth of fruit and butter braids.



#### **State Fair Livestock Rule Updates**

New 4hOnline Process for families for beef, sheep, swine, goat weigh-in's - families will input all information in 4hOnline and county staff will approve it

Beef - acceptable tags USDA (JKD1234) or EID (14-15 digits)

**Swine-** DNA punch tag required for State Fair and USDA tag (JKD1234) or EID tag (14-15 digits); ractopamine/ paylean substance is allowed

Beef/Meat Goat/Sheep/Swine - continue to use the declared weight system

Horse - Eliminating the mini horse

Meat Goat 4-H & FFA - no fit shows (no adhesives, paint, color, oils, other aerosols or powder products); clipping will be allowed

#### **Smithfield Swine Project**

Smithfield will be offering the Smithfield Swine Production Class again this year. This will be the second year for this class and we are very excited to be offering it again! A little background about this class is below.

Smithfield hog production has stepped up to help fund this class as they will provide each exhibitor that is interested with four hogs around seventy-five pounds. Pigs will be available around March or April at fifty dollars a piece from their source of pigs. .

The structure of the program would be centered around more of the day to day activities with the kids getting to bring the pigs to the fair. These pigs would show in a separate class of just these hogs and be judged on the uniformity of the group as well as the records that are kept. The day to day activities would be the daily care of the hogs and record keeping. Each exhibitor would need to keep track of the feed, medications, daily observations of the pigs and visitors to the farm. Each exhibitor would also need to conduct a line of separation within the guidelines of the secure pork act and pass a mock site assessment and common swine audit performed by a certified PQA plus advisor.

#### **Horse Exhibitors from Horse Superintendent Cori Kragel**

Spring is approaching! Which means we all are getting anxious to get out and spend some quality time with our fuzzy friends. Remember we must always use caution when getting the horses out for the first time in the spring; both you and your horse are going to be a little rusty.

Starting Tuesday, May 4<sup>th</sup> through Tuesday, July 13<sup>th</sup> we will be having clinics. **You must attend a minimum of 4 clinics to be able to show at the county fair.** These will be progressive clinics building on skills and goals from previous clinics. If you are not able to attend it will be YOUR responsibility to reach out to me to find out what was covered in missed clinics. On Sunday, Mar 28<sup>th</sup> we will have a meeting to plan clinic topic, time and place to be determined. Please keep an eye on the Facebook page or contact Cori Kragel at 712-790-9111 or jeffcorikragel@outlook.com to get on the notification list. Depending on weather maybe we could incorporate the horses into it too! On Sunday, April 25<sup>th</sup> hopefully we can plan a group trail ride or an activity with another county, I am currently working on this so there is no more information to give, just save the date.

I will be offering ON SITE leases with a couple of my horses. The Iowa 4-H Horse lease MUST be used and terms and conditions will have to be worked out with exhibitors, exhibitor's families, and me. There will be a signed leased on file with the county. I have a variety of horses to chose from based on your goals with the horse. If you are wanting to ride you will need a helmet — I will NOT provide one for you. Another thing to consider, I have tack that fit me and my family, if my tack does not fit you it is YOUR responsibility to acquire your own. In the month of April, I welcome any exhibitor interested come visit me and my horses. You can meet them, we can start a conversation, and see if this is something you are interested in.
