

ISU Extension and Outreach Mask Mandate

John Lawrence—Vice President for ISU Extension and Outreach has extending the mask mandate for ISU Extension and Outreach to May 8. Masks are required when people are indoors and not able to maintain 6 feet of distance from each other. This includes campus and county extension offices and meeting spaces. Masks are required outdoors if people are within 6 feet of each other. Masks are required when traveling on ISU business with more than one person in the vehicle. May 15 ID Deadline

All livestock must be identified in 4H Online 2.0 for eligibility to exhibit at county fairs and the lowa State Fair by May 15, with the exception of poultry and rabbit. Poultry and rabbit have until July 1. https://v2.4honline.com/
These are NOT your entries for the fair, entries will need to be made on FairEntry. For help on how to enter your animals on 4-H Online 2.0 go to https://www.extension.iastate.edu/4h/livestock-id State Fair Swine DNA
Envelopes must be turned into the extension office by May 15.

FairEntry

FairEntry is where you make your entries for the fair, FairEntry will open on June 1 and close on July 1. To be eligible to show at the Crawford County Fair you must be a member is good standing, have your animals ID'd in 4-H Online, and completed your YQCA by July 1. This is also where you will make all your entries for static, clothing, communications and reserve stalls/pens. https://fairentry.com/

Member in Good Standing

Remember, to be a member in good standing, you must be re-enrolled in 4-H Online by February 1st. You also must go to at least four club meetings to be able to show at ANY fair.

If you have a sibling that is now able to join 4-H, simply log on to 4hOnline like usual and just click "Add a new Family Member". If they were in Clover Kids and already have a profile, simply reenroll them but make sure they have a 4-H club selected instead of Clover Kids under the participation tab.

For new families that are wanting to join 4-H, simply have them call the Extension Office or stop by so we can help them set up an account and get information needed for new 4-H members.

YQCA

If you plan to exhibit livestock (beef, goats, poultry, rabbit, sheep and/or swine) at any show or fair you need to complete online YQCA training (FSQA is no longer accepted).

There is a \$12 fee to complete this training. The Crawford County Extension Office will cover the cost to those that sell \$250 worth of fruit and butter braids. http://yqca.org/



State Fair Livestock Rule Updates

New 4hOnline Process for families for beef, sheep, swine, goat weigh-in's - families will input all information in 4hOnline and county staff will approve it

Beef - acceptable tags USDA (JKD1234) or EID (14-15 digits)

Swine- DNA punch tag required for State Fair and USDA tag (JKD1234) or EID tag (14-15 digits); ractopamine/paylean substance is allowed


Beef/Meat Goat/Sheep/Swine - continue to use the declared weight system

Horse - Eliminating the mini horse

Meat Goat 4-H & FFA - no fit shows (no adhesives, paint, color, oils, other aerosols or powder products); clipping will be allowed

Events—Equine Extravaganza Sept. 24-26, 2021, Animal Science Roundup June 29-July 1, 2021, Dairy Judging Aug. 11, 2021 and Livestock & Meats Judging Aug. 28, 2021





Pens of Three

Sheep and swine pens of three will **NOT** be exhibited at the Crawford County Fair. Youth can participate in the Pen of Three static project on Static Judging Day. There will be a packet available June 1 which will be similar to the bucket bottle project. Youth will receive a ribbon premium for the project and animals will not be able to go through the sale.

Foods for Iowa 4-H Fairs- Quick Reference Guide

Food and nutrition exhibits involve fun and engaging food science and nutrition experiments. Exhibits should be prepared with food safety in mind. Using unsafe ingredients or recipes could cause judges who evaluate exhibits to become ill. Plan ahead for a successful fair experience. Use these guidelines to help you select an acceptable product for exhibit, find an approved recipe source, and identify the

All exhibits that come to the fair should have a write up/goal sheet attached! A write up should explain what you planned to learn/ goals you had for the project. You should also talk about what steps you took to do this and what were the most important things you learned? 
4-Her's for 4-H Campaign
