


Crawford County 4-H Newsflash September 2021

Record Books

The purpose of 4-H record keeping is to teach how to keep records, which is an important life skill. Record keeping is an ongoing process that does not end when the 4-H year ends.

Record books are due no later than October 1st! Record book materials can be found online at https://www.extension.iastate.edu/crawford/4h or https://www.extension.iastate.edu/4h/record-keeping. Every record book that is turned in MUST have a member application for 4-H awards and member application for special 4-H awards (filled out by the 4-H member, books that don't have these won't be considered for awards).

Record books should also have one yearly summary, and the correct project record sheets for each project. It is also a good idea to include the club program, pictures, newspaper clippings, etc. If you have any additional questions or need one-on-one help, please feel free to call Aubrey at the Extension Office at 712-263-4697.

County Council Record Book Workshop

Record books are due to the extension office by October 1. If youth want to receive their fair premium or receive awards, they must turn in a record book.

Project Area or Exhibit?

What is the difference between a 4-H project and a 4-H exhibit? Each year, 4-H members enroll in project areas that interest them. They set goals to plan what they will learn in each project area. When they bring things to fair to show what they learned, these are called exhibits. Paradise Presenters 4-H Club will focus on communication

Members will have opportunities to improve their communication skills!

The single most important skill that youth can learn that will take them into adulthood is communication. Newly reorganized Paradise Presenters 4-H Club will focus on all forms of communication, including the traditional 4-H communication events, speech, photography, art, and other forms of communication.

"Every career requires communication," said Christy Welch, leader. "When interviewing for a job, most employers look for candidates who are good communicators. Employers are also looking for candidates who have critical thinking abilities, leadership skills, a positive attitude, and can work as a team. A lot of these 'soft skills' can be learned early in life. Paradise Presenters will help members learn these important skills."

The club will work on 4-H communication events. Youth will also learn how communication fits into a variety of careers and non-traditional ways of communication such as photography and visual arts. Activities will be shaped by what the members want to learn.

Meetings will usually be at 1 pm on last Sunday of each month in the Fellowship Hall of the First United Methodist Church in Denison. Students from 4^{th} grade to 12^{th} grade are invited to join the 4-H club. Members who are already in a traditional club are welcome and encouraged to dual enroll in the Paradise Presenters.
