

# Project and Special Awards

## Who can Apply?

- Project Awards Members must meet the following qualification
- 4-H Members who have completed 5<sup>th</sup> grade or higher.
  - Must have completed 2 years in project. (does not have to be consecutive)
  - Project areas are listed at the bottom
  - A 4-H member can receive each county project award once as a junior, once as an intermediate and once as a senior member.

Special Awards In Achievement, Leadership, Citizenship members need to have the following qualifications:

1. Be at least a high school Sophomore
2. Three or more years in 4-H
3. Demonstrate leadership, citizenship, and achievement beyond club level.
4. Member may receive these awards only once.

Danforth, I Dare You Award – members must meet the following qualifications

1. Senior Age 4-H'er (9<sup>th</sup> -12<sup>th</sup> grade)
2. Excellence in character, well balanced development and demonstrated qualities of constructive leadership.

## How does a 4-H'er apply?

1. Review the project awards areas available on the bottom of this page.
2. Select the project areas in which you want to apply. This should be project areas that the member has spent considerable time or has done more than one exhibit for fair in that project area.
3. Fill out Project Award or Special Award forms available at the Extension office or online and turn into office by October 1<sup>st</sup>.
4. Turn in Record Book by October 1<sup>st</sup>.

## When are the selections made?

The Youth & 4-H Committee will have interviews and make the selections. Members will be notified in November at the County Awards Night.
