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GENERAL INFORMATION:

- There will be no food stands this year. Please plan accordingly and bring your own water, drinks, and food.
- Unfortunately, there will be no club booths this year, and static exhibits will be picked up at schedule pick up time on Wednesday (July 22)
- There will only be two bathrooms available (located in the 4-H static building) these will be cleaned frequently.
- The bleachers will not be available to sit on in the show arenas. Please follow social distancing when watching classes.

Static Projects:

- Entries are due July 17th on Fair Entry.
- You will do drop off and pick up at the 4-H static building on the fairgrounds
- For safety of judges and youth, we are NOT having conference judging. Instead, we will schedule drop off/pick up appointments, the judge will judge your projects and write ups. We are encouraging the judges to write comments so you can receive feedback on your projects.

- There will be a drive through line for the drop off/pick up process.
- Everyone is to remain in their vehicles until it is your turn to get out.
- Make sure you have everything ready for drop off to move fast and smoothly:
 - Goal sheets need to be attached so they don't fall off
 - If ONE project has multiple pieces, you need to include labels with: name and club on each piece of the project.
- The pick-up process will be the same as drop off.
- FOOD AND NUTRITION:
 - o There is NO judging on food and nutrition exhibits this year. We encourage you to do an education presentation for the judges to judge instead. Make sure to include in your write up, what it tastes like!

Static Tips:

Since youth are not able to speak about their projects face to face with the judge, your GOAL SHEET becomes very important because that is what is taking place of the interview with the judge. You are encouraged to answer the questions fully, and include any extra information that you want to tell the judge! Like always, we have Goal Sheet Tips on the extension website and printed at the office. We also are willing to help you identify what classes projects should be entered in. As always, do not hesitate to reach out for questions.

Communications Event:

- Those exhibitors who entered for this event back in March, have received emails with information on how this project area will be judged.

Clothing Event:

- We will have our clothing event on July 16th. Watch for a schedule to come with your judging time and details.
- There will be a Webex link sent out to participating families so they can have family members watch a virtual fashion show.
- The participant can have one other person with them, to maintain social distancing.

Livestock Shows (broke down by specie):

General Information:

- Entries are due July 9th on Fair Entry
- Exhibitors will check-in/weigh-in at scheduled times.
 - o Sheep, Goat, Swine, Beef will be brought in the night before, and the show will start at 8am the following day for these four shows.
 - o Rabbits & Poultry will check in from 8:00AM (one family checking in at a time) After check in, wait for class breaks and the program, and those shows will start at 2:00PM.
 - o Pets (open and 4-H)/Dogs/Horses – we break classes and make the program prior to your event. Please arrive early so you are ready for the show to start.
- Sheep, Goat, Swine, Beef are weighed in the night before they show, and are expected to stay on the fairgrounds in pens or trailers overnight. NO ANIMALS WILL BE LEAVING AFTER WEIGH IN.
- Families are encouraged to sign up for the APP 'REMIND' for updates regarding check ins, show program link, and class breakdowns during the show, to minimize parents coming back and forth between show barn and trailers/barn.
- If you choose to wear a face covering, youth should practice working with their animals with wearing face coverings on. Animals might get spooked if they see something on your face.
- Wash Racks will be available to clean your animals before showing. Please follow social distancing when using the wash racks.
- You will need to provide your own equipment, such as: pitchforks, shovels, hoses, combs etc.
- Once you/your family is done showing, you are to leave, and not hang around until the show is over. This is to minimize crowd gatherings.
- You are REQUIRED to clean out the manure and wet spots in the pens, if you are stalling in the barns. This way, families that come in the next day, will not have a messy stall.
- No hand shaking of the judge is allowed this year.
- Families will tell extension staff what ear tag #'s (for swine, sheep, goats, beef market animals) are going on truck by July 6th (if any).
- **THERE WILL BE NO AUCTION THIS YEAR**

- Audience at shows:
 - o These shows will NOT be open to the public. We will post links for livestreaming details closer to the fair.
 - o NO PROFESSIONAL PHOTOGRAPHERS ARE ALLOWED
 - o We're only allowing each participant to bring their parents/guardians, and siblings to the fair.
 - o All club leaders are able to attend to watch the show while following social distancing guidelines. Leaders may want to bring a lawn chair.

Information by species/show:

HORSES:

- Show – Wednesday July 22 @8AM
- Horse exhibitors need to be on the grounds by 7am to be ready to start the show by 8am
- We will contact exhibitors to check in animals and will post the show program by Tuesday.

PETS:

- 4-H and OPEN pet show Wednesday July 22 @1PM
- Check in will be at 12:45PM on Wednesday with show starting at 1PM
- We will call exhibitors to check in pets, and will post the show program by Tuesday.

SHEEP/GOAT:

- WEIGH IN: Wednesday July 22 @4PM
- Families will need to wait in vehicles until their name is called to bring lambs/goats into get weighed in
- Stalls will be first come first serve.
 - o If families can work from their trailers, we encourage this. There will be spacing of pens between the lambs/goats by family in the swine barn (where the lambs/goats will be stalled if needed)
- Animals need to be sheared before coming to weigh in.
- SHOW: Thursday July 23 @8AM
- Remember, no Rate of Gain due to not having a weigh-in.

RABBIT:

- CHECK IN: Thursday July 23 @8AM
- SHOW: Thursday July 23 @2PM
- Social distance yourselves while you are waiting for classes to break and a program to posted.

SWINE:

- WEIGH IN: Thursday July 23 @4PM
- Families will wait in vehicles until their name is called to bring swine into get weighed in
- Packers Choice ultrasound – after weigh in – still being decided, more information later once final decision is made.
- Swine are to be stalled in pens, and will be an empty pen in between each family. Overflow will go into the sheep/goat barn.
- Animals should be clipped before coming to weigh-in
- SHOW: Friday July 24 @8AM

POULTRY:

- CHECK IN: Friday July 24 @8AM
- SHOW: Friday July 24 @2PM
- Social distance yourselves while you are waiting for classes to break and program to be posted.

DOG:

- CHECK IN: Program will be posted day before show. Please arrive 15 minutes before the show to prepare your dog and for the dog to go to the bathroom.
- SHOW: Saturday July 25 @8AM

4H BUCKET CALF/OPEN BUCKET/BOTTLE SHOW:

- Please arrive around 11AM to unload & ready for show at noon
- SHOW: Saturday July 25 @12PM (noon)

BEEF:

- WEIGH IN: Saturday July 25 @4PM
- Families will need to wait in vehicles until their name is called to bring cattle in to get weighed in. Have all beef animals ready for weigh in.
- Pen of 3 cattle will be weighed in with family at their weigh-in time.
- Stalls are first come first serve for lead calves. Encouragement of working from trailers.
 - o Pen of 3 and Cow/Calf will be stalled in the barn
- Breeding heifers/Cow/Calf will need to be told to extension staff at weigh in- you can give a verbal check-in
- RFID Tags will be inserted into ears of beef animals that are going onto truck to Tyson at weigh in.
- SHOW: Sunday July 26 @8AM
- There will be NO FITTING at show. Only things allowed: blower, hose, & combs.
 - o There will be NO use of adhesives, paints, etc.
 - o You are allowed to use any type of oil, such as: Kleen Sheen, Pink Oil, Shock, Final Bloom, etc.
