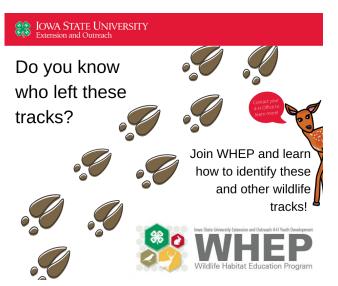

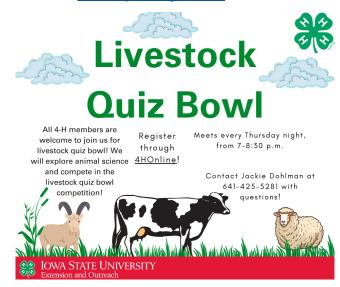

#### Waterloo Black Hawk 4-H Night

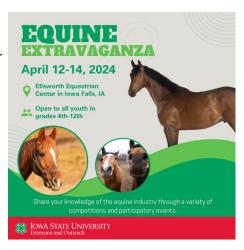

#### **PEANUT BUTTER BALLS**

#### **NGREDIENTS**

1 can (15 ounces) great northern beans (drained and rinsed)

1/3 cup honey

1 tablespoon vanilla

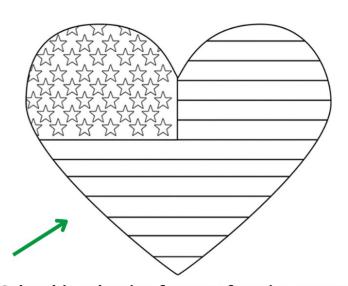
1 1/4 cups peanut butter

1 1/2 cups quick cooking oats

#### **INSTRUCTIONS**

- 1, Mash the great northern beans with a fork in a bowl until smooth.
- 2. Add the honey and vanilla. Stir.
- 3. Add peanut butter. Stir until blended.
- 4. Stir in the oatmeal.
- 5. Wash hands. Use a tablespoon to scoop up some of the peanut butter mixture. Shape the mixture into balls (makes 50 balls).
- 6. Store leftover balls in an airtight container in the refrigerator.

Anxiety is the feeling of worry or nervousness, usually about something coming up that you are uncertain about. All of us feel anxious from time to time; maybe you get butterflies in your stomach before you must give a speech in class, or your heart feels like it's pounding before you take a math test. Maybe you forgot to take out the trash, and your parent or guardian is upset, and you feel tingly in your arms and hands. These are all signs your body sends you to tell you it feels like something is wrong or something dangerous is near.

You may have heard this being called your fight, flight, or freeze response. Your body feels like there is a threat to our safety, and it is getting your body and mind ready to run away or fight the threat or freeze in place. It is helpful if you are in danger but what if you are having those symptoms during your everyday life when there is no threat to your safety?

Anxiety among children and teens has been on the rise in recent years. Just over 7% of youth aged 3-17 have been diagnosed with some form of anxiety. That may not seem like a big number, but that comes out to over 4 million kids dealing with anxiety (CDC, 2021).

The good news is that you can do some easy things at home to help you when you are feeling anxious to help stop your body from engaging in the fight, flight, or freeze response. The one we are going to focus on here is breathing. Breathing relaxes a nerve that goes from your stomach to your brain, sending a signal to relax (TeensHealth, 2016).



On your piece of paper, draw a square. Now take your paper and move to a comfortable place to sit and get comfortable. It is recommended that you sit with both feet on the ground for this to be most effective. Before beginning, take a couple of deep breaths for practice. Make sure that you are breathing into your stomach area when taking your deep breaths. You should see or feel your stomach area getting bigger as you breathe in and then smaller when you breathe out.

- Take your paper and place your finger on one corner of your square.
  With your finger or your eyes, trace the line along the side to the next corner while breathing in. While tracing the line, slowly count to 4. When counting, say to yourself, 1 Mississippi, 2 Mississippi, 3 Mississippi, 4 Mississippi; this helps ensure that you are not counting too fast or too slow.
