YQCA Certification





If you will be exhibiting livestock (beef, bucket calf, dairy, dairy goats, meat goats, poultry, rabbits, sheep, and swine) at the county and/or state fairs YOU MUST GET YQCA CERTIFIED every year!! Youth for the Quality Care of Animals certification is required for all 4-H and FFA youth. Certification MUST be obtained by completing a course on-line. This requires both registration and payment online at: https://yqcaprogram.org/

Here you will need to create your own YQCA account using your 4hOnline account.

Deadline to become certified is May 15!!

Fair Pig Tagging



4-H youth can identify up to 40 pigs for county fair. 4-H Pigs must have official 4-H USDA ear tag and ear notches. Tags and tagger must be picked up at the Extension



Office. Tags cost \$2.00 each, \$25 deposit on tagger. FFA pigs will be tagged by your Advisor. **Must be done and identified by May 15**. 4-H families are required to enter all pig information in 4hOnline!!

State Fair 4-H swine will require the official 4-H ear tag AND a DNA tag! State Fair DNA tags cost \$10.00 each and a \$25 deposit on the tagger. **Must be done by May 15!!**

Livestock Identification Due!



If you (a 4-H member) are expecting to take a four-legged animal to the fair it must be identified!!! Livestock identification forms for swine, breeding sheep and cattle, dairy cattle, dairy and meat goats, and horses must be filled out by YOU on 4hOnline before 11:59 p.m., May 15! 4-H bucket calf and all rabbit identifications are due July 1. FFA members are responsible for completing and turning in livestock identification to their Ag Advisor by May 15.

Poultry all birds must be blood tested, Tuesday, 6:30 p.m., July11 at the rab-bit/poultry tent.

Horse show is on Sunday.

All **breeding beef** require a tattoo **and:** registration number (purebred), or calfhood vaccination or official 4-H/FFA tag.

4-H Camp!

The "Wildlife Spies!" camp for members in 4th-6th grades will be held as a two - day camp at Maynes Grove Park, **Tuesday, June 20 and Wednesday, June 21**. We will take time to explore our local park, make some crafts, eat and sing around a campfire, and finish day 1 with a night hike!

On day 2, Franklin County Conservation will teach us how to safely use canoes and kayaks, and about the wildlife habitats within the park! Our camp will end with a camouflaged potato hunt, s'mores, campfire singing, and the traditional t-shirt autographs!
