HERDSMANSHIP CONTEST

Superintendents: Youth Committee, Fair Board

1. *4-H and FFA members should plan to have animal chores down by 9 AM each day of the fair.*
2. *Judges will come through the barns twice a day between 9 AM – 6 PM.*
3. *The barn area for a species will not be judged 1 hour prior, during, or at least 1 hour following the species' show on the day of the show.*
4. *Clubs will work together in each barn to earn the award.*
5. *The Golden Broom Award will be displayed in the winning barn for a day. Each exhibitor from the winning barn will also be treated to a popsicle at the food stand from the Fremont County 4-H Youth Committee.*
6. *The Golden Broom Award will be based on the following criteria:*
 - a. *CLEANLINESS OF ALLEYS, STALLS, PENS AND/OR CAGES (45 points)*
 - *Bedding adequate, bright, dry, clean and in place.*
 - *Animals securely tied or penned.*
 - *Feed boxes in front of animals only at feeding time.*
 - *Fan and blocking chute rules observed.*
 - *Manure hauled out and deposited in proper place.*
 - *Alleys swept clean, free of dust and straw.*
 - *Watering points and drains kept clean.*
 - b. *ARRANGEMENT OF EXHIBIT (20 points)*
 - *Exhibits lined up in attractive manner.*
 - *Big, objectionable boxes out of the way.*
 - *Hay and straw neat and orderly.*
 - *Feed boxes, blocking chutes and miscellaneous gear in area provided.*
 - c. *APPEARANCE OF ANIMALS (15 points)*
 - *Animals clean and brushed.*
 - *Animals in stalls, pens, or cages between 9 AM and 6 PM.*
 - d. *STALL CARDS (10 points)*
 - *Readable from alley.*
 - *Neatly arranged.*
 - *Clean and complete.*
 - e. *ATTENDANTS (10 points)*
 - *Courtesy of the attendants and others in area.*
 - *Presence of attendant during judging.*

PREMIUM SALE

Superintendents: Youth Committee, Fair Board

1. Premium Sale is open to FFA and 4-H exhibitors with beef, dairy, goats, horse, poultry, rabbits, sheep, and/or swine.
2. Premium Sale Only. No animals change hands.
3. Each exhibitor must register for the Premium Sale by the deadline according to the Fair Schedule.
4. The program will list youth and parents' names, number of exhibits in projects listed above, Grand Champion, Reserve Champion and Showmanship winner. No other projects or ribbons will be listed.
5. Participants are required to enter the ring in appropriate exhibitor's attire as listed in the Livestock Department General Rules and Regulations.
6. Species will all sell at one time and by random order.
7. Each exhibitor will enter the ring once.
8. Exhibitors MUST show their own animals. Substitutions will not be allowed, unless in emergency situations approved by Fair Rules Committee.
9. Animals that will be shown in the Premium Sale are not allowed to leave the fairgrounds. They must be housed on the grounds from check-in until they have been exhibited in the Premium Sale.
Exception: Horse exhibits
10. Money will be collected by the Fremont County Extension District and distributed to exhibitors as soon as possible.
11. When an exhibitor earns \$600 or more, a W-9 tax form is required and a 1099 tax form will be issued as required.
