

# Open Class Livestock

## A. BOTTLE/BUCKET CALF

*Chairperson: Jeremy Walter*

1. Project is open to all area youth.
2. Calf must be born after January 1 of the current year.
3. Calf must be bucket and/or bottle fed.
4. Calf must be shown by owner.
5. Show will be held according to the Fair Schedule.
6. An exhibitor is limited to one calf in this division.
7. All calves will be shown on halter and should be clean and groomed.
8. Exhibitors may be asked questions regarding:
  - a. Care and management of raising the calf.
  - b. Showing/handling of the calf.
  - c. Fitting, general health, and condition of the calf and child's knowledge of the project.
  - d. Appropriate record-keeping.
9. Quality and conformation of the calf will NOT be considered in the bottle/bucket program.
10. Exhibitors must follow the fair's General, Open Class and Health Rules as listed in the fair book. These include, but are not limited to, the following:
  - a. No evidence of warts, ringworm, pinkeye, or other infectious conditions will be allowed.
  - b. All exhibitors must show his/her own animal in partnership with a caring adult.
  - c. Exhibitors are responsible for the care of their animals in partnership with caring adults.
11. Calves will be brought to the fair on the day of the show and return home the same day.
12. Ribbons only; no premiums will be paid.
13. Categories include:
  - a. Bull Calf
  - b. Steer Calf
  - c. Heifer Calf

## B. FEEDER CALF

*Chairperson: Jeremy Walter*

1. Project is open to all interested parties.
2. Owners of out-of-state animals must present health inspection papers.
3. Calves must be born on or after January 1 of the previous year.
4. Calves may arrive at any time but will not be provided with stalls.
5. Feeder calf exhibitors must follow the fair's General, Open Class and Health Rules as listed in the fair book. These include, but are not limited to, the following:
  - a. No evidence of warts, ringworm, pinkeye, or other infectious conditions will be allowed.
6. Registration will begin at 11 AM on day of show and remain open until the close of the Bottle/ Bucket Calf Show.
7. A \$5 registration fee per calf will be collected at registration, payable to Fremont County Fairboard. No refunds will be issued for any reason.
8. Calves will be unloaded on the north end of the fairgrounds.
9. Feeder calves are not allowed to be shown with adhesive or paint and will be disqualified.
10. Exhibitors are encouraged to bring generators for the use of grooming.
11. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up their area following the Feeder Calf show.
12. Winners will be announced. Ribbons and premiums will not be awarded.

13. If classes are too large, they will be divided using the birthdate of the calf by month.

14. Categories include:

- a. Bull Calf
- b. Steer Calf
- c. Heifer Calf

C. BOTTLE/BUCKET SHEEP OR GOAT

*Chairperson: Daniel Whitehead, Jed Whitehead*

1. Project is open to all area youth.
2. Sheep or goat must be born after January 1.
3. Sheep or goat must be bucket and/or bottle fed.
4. Sheep or goat must be shown by owner.
5. Show will be held according to the Fair Schedule.
6. An exhibitor is limited to one entry in this division.
7. Animals entered into this class do not need to be ear-tagged or registered before the fair.
8. Animals entered in this class will be shown on halter and should be clean and groomed.
9. Exhibitors may be asked questions regarding:
  - a. Care and management of raising the sheep or goat.
  - b. Showing/handling of the sheep or goat.
  - c. Fitting, general health, and condition of the sheep or goat and child's knowledge of the project.
  - d. Appropriate record-keeping.

10. Quality and conformation of the animal will NOT be considered in the bottle/bucket program.

11. Exhibitors must follow the fair's General, Open Class and Health Rules as listed in the fair book.

These include, but are not limited to, the following:

- a. No evidence of warts, ringworm, pinkeye, or other infectious conditions will be allowed.
- b. All exhibitors must show his/her own animal in partnership with a caring adult.
- c. Exhibitors are responsible for the care of their animals in partnership with caring adults.

12. Animals in this class will be brought to the fair on the day of the show and return home the same day.

13. Ribbons only; no premiums will be paid.

14. Categories include:

- a. Goat – Wether
- b. Goat - Doe
- c. Sheep – Wether
- d. Sheep – Doe
