Want to show a lamb at the fair? Not quite sure where to start? Check out our Lotto Lamb opportunity.

What is this class? This class is an excellent way for you to get started in sheep, or a way to work with a quality show lamb. The lambs will be purchased from a reputable breeder by your sheep superintendents. Then you purchase the lambs from your superintendent and pick them up at sheep weigh-in in April.



<u>Down payment</u> is \$100 and price for the lambs will be determined by the market value at time of purchase.

\$100,000 IN 4-H SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE

The Iowa 4-H Foundation announces the 2024 scholarship programs for 4-Hers attending or planning to attend college fall 2024 (minimum 12 credit hours). Even current college students are eligible for 4-H scholarships.

The various awards range in amounts from \$250 to \$5,000. Some of the scholarships are open to students pursuing any field of study, while others are open to students pursuing degrees in agriculture, food and nutrition, ag business, animal science, and journalism.

Former Iowa 4-Hers and current 4-Hers graduating from high school are eligible applicants.

When asked about her scholarship experience a past Hancock County 4-Her says, "Applying for a State Level 4-H scholarship is a very extensive process. A bonus of the 4-H scholarship is the

information I provided made me eligible for numerous different scholarships, all different amounts. It was the toughest scholarship I applied for but in the end one of the most rewarding ones I received."

Applicants must enroll as a full-time student (minimum of 12 credit hours) to receive scholarship awards. Only ONE application form is needed for all lowa 4-H scholarships. 4-H Scholarship information (can be sorted by school or degree), forms, and applications are available on the 4-H web page:

www.iowa4hfoundation.org/scholarships
Applications must be submitted online no later than 11:59 pm March 1, 2024, for consideration.

Applications require two letters of recommendation so be sure to ask those people before the due date so they have time to complete those for you.
