Reminder to all 4th-12th graders:

4-H animal data <u>MUST</u> be entered into 4-H Online by Monday, May 15th to be eligible to show at the 2023 Hancock County District Fair or lowa State Fair. If 4th-12th graders have animals that are not entered by May 15th, they will NOT be shown at the 2023 Hancock County District Fair. **NO exceptions!** (Poultry, Pets, and Rabbits must be entered by June 15th).

### SHOWING FOODS AT FAIR

Everyone eats food, and it is easy to exhibit at the fair. The best baseline to consider when thinking about what food to show at the fair is refrigeration. Only foods that do not need refrigeration can



show at the fair. The document Foods for Iowa 4-H Fairs - Quick Reference Guide is very valuable when considering what food to exhibit. It will walk you through what foods are acceptable and what specific things your recipe will need to include. This document can be found on our website or the Iowa 4-H website or stop by and grab a copy from the office.

Any recipes you question for acceptability can be sent to the lowa State University Extension and Outreach AnswerLine to get official approval or acceptable modifications. Please email your recipe and questions to answer@iastate.edu. Print their reply and any modification instructions and include this documentation with your goal sheet when you exhibit at the fair.

We are excited to see what recipes will be shown this year. One sample and a photo of the food item will be displayed and the rest returned to the 4-H member. Food can be on the online exhibit auction but must be made fresh for pickup on Sunday

afternoon.

Missy Huling helped us learn about negative space paintings and how to tape a pattern or image to leave it as wood for your finished creation.








We had a great time and even some parents painted with us.

#### 2023 Rule Changes & Reminders

#### Livestock General/Auction

- All exhibitors must be in good standings with the Fair Board (no unpaid bills) in order to receive exhibitor number. Bills will carry from year to year.
- If an animal's health is in question, it will be asked to be removed and will not be eligible for auction.
- No private sales are permitted to be transported by the truck. If animals are not going through the auction you must make your own transportation arrangements.
- Failure to properly clean stalls upon check out will result in a \$50 stall cleaning fee.

#### Pre 4-H Youth Livestock

 All bucket bottle animals and feeder calves must be checked in between 7:00 am – noon, Wednesday, July 26th.

#### Beef/Dairy

- All market steers must meet a minimum average daily gain of 2.3 lbs per day or more to qualify for champion drive or to receive grand or reserve titles.
- All market heifers must meet a minimum average daily gain of 2.1 lbs per day or more to qualify for champion drive or to receive grand or reserve titles.
- Animals are only allowed to show in ONE lead market animal class. Except: County Bred animals should sign up for the county bred class to return to the ring for special county champion awards.

#### Horse

- Ties for high point/all around will be broken by:
- 1. Most first place finishes on the horse/rider combination.
- 2. Most purple ribbons received, continuing down with ribbon color until tie is broken
- Ranch pleasure class added. Must choose western pleasure or ranch pleasure.

#### Horticulture

 Judging for flowers and veggies will take place on Tuesday, July 25th from noon- 3:30 pm.

#### Poultry

- Check-in will be 3:00 5:00 pm on Tuesday, July 25.
- There will be 2 posted barn clean out times. Please make every effort to have the exhibitor or someone representing the exhibitor present to help clean out the barn at these times.
- Animal well-being checks will be performed 3 times each day. If animals are found without water, they will be rechecked within 2 hours. Completely dry water dishes past the recheck time will result in a warning (Yellow zip tie). Second time offenses will no longer be eligible for auction (Red zip tie).

#### Rabbit

- Show will start at 2:00 pm on Friday, July 28.
- There will be 2 posted barn clean out times. Please make every effort to have the exhibitor or someone representing the exhibitor present to help clean out the barn at these times.
- RABBITS HAVE TO HAVE PERMAMENT EAR TATTOOS PRIOR to coming to the fair. If rabbits are found to have no/not permanent, or a fresh tattoo (within a few days), or the wrong tattoo they will not be able to show.
- Appropriate food and water dishes must be used. If rabbits are found without food or water the exhibitor will be found to fix the problem. If the problem persists, the exhibitor will be asked to take the animal home and not be eligible for auction.

#### Sheep

- Check-in is from 10:00 am noon Wednesday, July 26.
- Class added for speckle face lambs in both breeding and market divisions of show.

#### **Swine**

- Limit of how many head you can show in each class has been removed.
- We will be able to sell animals to a packer from the auction again this year. There will also be an option to sell additional animals (even extras from home that didn't show) directly to the packer and help fill the truck.

#### Static/Non-Livestock

- Judging for Clothing Event will take place on Tuesday,
   July 25th during all other static judging
- Educational Presentations and Clothing Event Style show will take place with Share The Fun on Thursday, July 27th at 4:00 pm.
- \$15 Clothing Challenge class has been updated to \$20 Clothing Challenge Class.
- The Thrifty Meal Challenge budget has increased from \$10 to \$11.

## **YQCA - REQUIRED TRAINING HANCOCK COUNTY 2023** REQUIRED YQCA TRAINING

ALL 4-H (4th-12th grade) and FFA exhibitors who plan to show beef, sheep, swine, dairy, rabbit, poultry, or goats at County or State Fair MUST be YQCA certified.

#### WHAT ARE MY OPTIONS?

- 1. You can attend a face-to-face YQCA training. Class sizes are limited and you must pre-register at yqcaprogram.org. (\$3 fee).
- 2. You can participate in the online YQCA training at yqcaprogram.org (\$12 fee).
- 3. You can test out if you are 12 or 15 years old as of January 1 (fee is determined upon what test option you are taking). Contact Extension Office for more information about this option.

Exhibitors **MUST** be certified by **July 1** to exhibit at the fair (both county and state)

This is a new system, everyone will need to make a new account. When making a new account register as a parent and put in the parent's birthdate. Then you can add multiple children to manage under a parent account.

### **ACHIEVEMENT SHOW -THURSDAY JUNE 29th**

Who: Recommended for anyone who wants 4-H static judging and paperwork tips, especially younger members.

What: Talk with a 4-H judge to make sure your exhibit is in the correct class, you have the right words and phrases in your paperwork, and you understand the judging process. Did you know? You don't have to fill out goal sheets or pre-register to show vegetables, flowers, and plants at the Hancock County District Fair?

Who: 4th-12th grade 4-H members (and FFA too)

What: Exhibit vegetables, flowers, and plants at the fair. Blue ribbon premiums are \$2.00 for each entry.

How: Refer to the Preparing Flowers and Plants for Exhibition & Harvesting and Preparing Vegetables for Exhibit documents available from the Extension Office or from Iowa 4-H online. They tell you exactly how to prepare each kind of veggie or flower.

When/Where: NEW FOR 2023!!! Flower and veggie judging will be on Tuesday, July 25th at the fairgrounds from noon- 3:30 pm. Sit with the judge like you do for other static exhibits.

Why: A simple way to have a fair exhibit without doing a goal sheet or caring for livestock. If you have any veggies or flowers already growing, just bring what you already worked to plant and grow.
