**My goal: What did you plan to learn or do?**

My goal was to decorate and assemble a 3 tier planter to place outside my front door.

**What I did in achieving my goal (in steps): What steps did you take to learn or do this? What decisions did you make in accomplishing your goal?**

1. I chose the color of spray paint I wanted on my big, medium, and small planter. Explain why you choose the colors that you picked.
2. The pots were then spray painted. We discovered that it was important to spray paint. Acrylic paint was just soaking into the pot and needed a base to stick to.
3. Stencil choices were: Welcome or house number. Say why you picked your choice.
4. I patiently waited for my big pot to dry then placed my stencil on the pot. Putting the stencil on the pot without it sticking together was tricky. I had to be careful.
5. I chose a color to stipple my stencil with and then waited for my stenciled paint to dry then took off the stencil. Explain how you picked where you were going to put the stencil and how you picked your paint color.
6. I then proceeded to decorate my big, medium, and small pots. If you used lines, dots, etc. how did you make them be in unity with the other pots so it looked like they all went together?
7. After they were completely dry, we put a top coat over the pots to make sure the weather wouldn't ruin them

**What I learned: What were the most important things you learned?**

I learned it is important to stipple when using a stencil so the paint does not get under the stencil where it is not supposed to be.

I also learned that spray paint and sealer spray need to be done in a well ventilated area so you don't get too many fumes.
