All Spring Fair Exhibitors will share their talents again during the Mighty Howard County Fair and at that time each 4-H'er will receive their ribbon(s).

Educational Presentations:

(scheduled by the Extension Office: 8:30-Noon)

- Opportunity for 4-H'ers to demonstrate communication skills by presenting knowledge, information, or a process to an audience in order to gain a desired response
- Maybe given by one or more 4-H'ers teams consisting of youth in mixed grades will be entered in the class of the member in the highest grade level
- Maximum length of presentations: Juniors 15 minutes and Intermediate/Senior 20 minutes
- · Use of sanitary, safe procedures and methods is always, particularly if food samples are available to audience
- Presenters are expected to comply with all copyright/trademark regulations. Copyrighted material may not be distributed without permission.
- Members in grades 5th 12th are eligible to represent Howard County at the Iowa State Fair in August

Working Exhibits: (scheduled by the Extension Office; 11:30 AM-12:15 PM)

- . Opportunity for 4-H'ers to communicate, interact with, and teach an audience in an informal and experiential way
- May be given by one or more 4-H'ers teams consisting of youth in mixed grades will be entered in the class of the member in the highest grade level
- Use of sanitary, safe procedures and methods, particularly if food samples are available to audience
- Presenters are expected to comply with all copyright/trademark regulations. Copyrighted material may not be distributed without permission.
- Members in grades 5th 12th are eligible to represent Howard County at the Iowa State Fair in August

Share-the-Fun: (scheduled by the Extension Office; 8:30-11:30 AM)

- Opportunity for 4-H'ers to share their skills and talents before an audience purely for the sake of enjoyment
- May not exceed 8 minutes in length
- Members in grades 5th 12th are eligible to represent Howard County at the State Fair in August. Those selected for the State Fair will perform in the Spring Fair afternoon public program.

Clothing Selection: (family calls Extension Office to schedule evaluation time)

- Select and/or purchase an outfit that represents the 4-H'ers goal or intended use for the selected outfit.
- Have had individual planned or county experience(s) in choosing shopping alternatives, evaluating fit, quality and construction features, price, and cost comparison.
- Members 9th-12th grades are eligible to be selected to represent Howard County at the lowa State Fair.

Fashion Revue: (family calls Extension Office to schedule evaluation time)

- Model a garment or outfit the participant has constructed, hand-knitted, machine-knitted, or crocheted during the current year 4-H year.
- A garment or outfit consisting of one to three pieces such as party clothes, tailored suits, vest, slacks, shirt, skirt, active sportswear and/or coats are acceptable as entries
- Blouses, shirts, and sweaters are usually considered as garments. If they are used to complete the outfit, they may be constructed or selected.
- All other accessories and undergarments may be constructed or selected
- Members 9th-12th grades are eligible to be selected to represent Howard County at the Iowa State Fair.

The \$20 Clothing Challenge: (family calls Extension Office to schedule evaluation time)

- Purchase an outfit that represents the 4-H'ers goal or intended use for the purchased outfit.
- Have had individual planned or county experience(s) in choosing shopping alternatives, evaluating fit, quality and construction features, price, and cost comparison.
- Outfits <u>must</u> be purchased at a garage sale, consignment store, or resale shop (i.e. Goodwill, Salvation Army, Unique Boutique, and other stores of this type.)
- Receipts must be turned in with the report form.
- Members 9th-12th grades are eligible to be selected to represent Howard County at the Iowa State Fair.

Innovative Design Class -

This class encourages creativity and out of the box thinking in creating an outfit. Can be Theatrical, costume play, wearable technology, sustainable/upcycled fashion, accessible fashion, and/or outfits that use unconventional materials. Showcased as a worn garment model by the exhibitor or by the individual it was designed for. Exhibitor may make their own garment entirely, or permanently alter the silhouette of pre-existing materials through some method of permanent alteration or addition.

At Spring Fair clothing projects will be modeled during the public program before results are shared with the participants.
