Really Important Dates:

June 17th -All fair entries are due including Communications, Garden Tour, Clothing Event, and STATIC Exhibits. Plus ID's for poultry, rabbit and pets are also due. Remember we will be using Fair Entry Online Service for our Fair Entries this year. YQCA also is due this day and will need to be done before you can complete your entries.

Fair Entries on FairEntry ~Due June 17th~

More information to come but this year we will be using an online platform called FairEntry. Look for an email on Monday May 17th or helpsheets on how to do entries. You will use your 4-H Online log in to enter your animals, it will also require you to enter your FSQA certificate number. Help sheet to be coming. **Static Projects will need to be entered by this date also so me thinking of your projects early.**

State Fair – Horticulture and Livestock Entries

State Fair livestock entries are due by **July 1** and need to be completed online. You will use your 4-H Online user name and password to log-in. The link to use is: https://iowastatefair4hlivestock.fairentry.com/ If you have any questions, please contact the office. Help sheets are also available at: http://www.extension.iastate.edu/4h/statefair/livestock Families will be able to pay online and this is highly encouraged. If you choose to pay by check, do NOT send the check to our office. All checks must go directly to the Iowa State Fair. Families can not add additional entries until any pending entries are approved. If paid online that will likely occur by the end of the next business day; if paid by check it may take up to a week. If you wait till the deadline, you may risk not being able to make additional entries.

Clay County Fair Entries

Identification:

Clay County Fair Only animals can be IDed until June 15th. You will ID them under the Clay County Fair Only by you as the family. You do not have to "nominate" specific animals for Clay County Fair, any animal eligible to show at your fair (as well as ID'd in 4-H Online) can be shown at Clay County Fair.

Entries:

Our entries open July 1 - August 1 through Fair Entry. YOUTH need to submit their OWN entries! An active link will be available on our Clay County Fair Information page starting July 1. https://www.extension.iastate.edu/clay/page/clay-county-fair-information Late entries will be accepted from August 2 - August 15 at 11:59pm in Fair Entry for an additional \$25 fee per 4-Her.

Copyright Info

Duplication of copyright material or design should not be used in a 4-H exhibit that is presented as original work by the exhibitor. A copyright design cannot be displayed in a public setting (fair) without permission being granted from the owner of the copyright. When permission has been granted by the owner of the copyright, the exhibit will be displayed and labeled appropriately. Those without permission cannot be displayed. Writing Goals

If you have a question, please visit with Kiersten. Goals Have 3 Parts: 1. **The Action**- How will you reach your goal? 2. **The Results**- What will you accomplish? 3. **The Timetable**- When are you going to do it? **Check Your Goal**: 1. Does it have the 3 basic parts? (listed above) 2. Do you have control over the goal? 3. Is it measurable? **An example of 4-H project goal**: I will learn how to make cinnamon rolls by county fair. (Food & Nutrition Exhibit goal, as I would have a plate of cinnamon rolls at the fair)

Clothing Event Info

Judging

Clothing Selection, Fashion Revue, and \$15 Challenge will have conference judging on July 5th starting at 9am. For more information contact Kiersten. Schedules and information will be sent out after fair entries are turned in. The youth will model and receive award placing on Wednesday, July 20th during the County Fair.

Group pictures will be taken at 6:30pm on Wednesday July 20th outside the Hewitt Hall building.

Fashion Revue

A garment or outfit maybe the entrant has constructed, hand knitted, machine-knitted, or crocheted. Check rules in the fair book.

Clothing Selection

Outfits may be selected and/or purchased from any source, including consignment shops, used clothing stores, etc. Clothing items which are home-sewn are not eligible unless the completed garment was purchased from a used clothing source. Clothing items which are custom sewn specifically for the participant are not eligible. Check rules in fair book. (health)

\$15 Challenge Clothing

All participants are challenged to search garage sales, consignment stores, Goodwill Stores, Salvation Army stores and others of this type and put together an outfit for \$15 or less. Receipts will be required, although they can be handwritten receipts for garage sales. The \$15 Challenge does not include shoes or accessories, although an individual participant may choose to include either or both in the \$15 Challenge. Garments purchased at end of season sales at regular retail outlets would not qualify for the \$15 Challenge category, but could be used for Clothing Selection. (The reason is to encourage alternate venues for shopping.) Guidelines for "an outfit' include a one piece garment such as a dress or a two piece outfit consisting of a top and bottom. Check rules in fair book.

Judging

Educational Presentations, Working Exhibits, Extemporaneous Speaking and Share the Fun judging on July 7th starting at 9am. For more information contact Kiersten.

Share the Fun

Provides an opportunity for 4-H members to perform before an audience purely for the sake of enjoyment. This can be skits, songs, dances, stunts, short one act plays, plus other entertainment will be acceptable. Maximum of 6 minutes in length. Check out the fair book for the rules and more information.



Communication Event Info Cont.

Educational Presentation

Youth have an opportunity to demonstrate their communication skills by presenting knowledge, information or a process to gain a desired response from the audience. Youth can say, do or show something about a topic that interests them and share with the audience. The audience will be sitting down and ready to listen. Check out the fair book for more information and rules.

Working Exhibits

Youth have an opportunity to communicate and interact with an audience in an informal way. The "audience" will be passing by the exhibit and one of the challenges to the exhibitor will be to attract their attention. Many stages of the exhibit or project should be used. The best subjects doing, feeling, tasting, smelling and judging. Exhibitors at county fair should have enough supplies to continue for half hour to forty-five minutes period (suggested to have enough supplies for 100). Check rules in fair book and for more information.

Extemporaneous Speaking

This contest is designed to encourage the development of the life skill of communicating with others through enhancing the ability to think, to organize, to speak, and to answer question readily. Participants will select one topic to speak on, topic relate to 4-H. The participants will have 30 minutes preparation time. Each speech shall be not less than four more than size minutes with five minutes additional time allowed for related questions. For more information and rules check the fair book.

Fair and Project Information

4-H Poster Communications

The object of this class is to provide the opportunity for 4-H'ers to tell a story or idea visual about 4-H to the general public using the nonverbal form of communication on a poster. This is an exhibit that will be judged on Tuesday, July 19th in the commercial building. For more information and rules check the fair book. No goal sheet is needed for this exhibit, but the youth does need to complete the Poster Communication Exhibit Report Form, which is in the fair book.

Challenge Class

Check out the rules in your fair book for the Challenge Classes: Photography, Food & Nutrition and Sewing Read over these classes and give them a try. There will be top awards given in each class.

Inappropriate Food Exhibit for Fair

Is your food exhibit appropriate? Ask yourself: 1. Does this product require refrigeration? 2. Would you eat this product at room temperature? 3. Will the product hold up so it represents a standard when evaluated by judges or viewed by the public? Check the details for specific products

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) is a national multi-species quality assurance program for youth ages 8 to 21 (4th– 12th graders) with a focus on three core pillars: food safety, animal well-being, and character development.

YQCA will be replacing the old verification services called FSQA. YQCA certification is the new required youth quality assurance certification. If you are planning on showing any of these animals you need to complete YQCA.

- Swine
- Cattle
- Sheep
- Goats
- Rabbits
- Poultry

YQCA is available as an online program for youth, you can now view it on your own time.

The way to complete this training is it go to http://yqca.org/, sign in using your 4-H Online log in. There is a \$12 fee per child to go with this training (if you need financial assistance please contact the office) which is paid when you log in your child. I ask that you have your training completed by June 17th 2022. Once you have completed the training you will see a certificate on your screen, you will then have to email that certificate to kbeilke@iastate.edu so that I have proof you completed it.

THIS YEAR IT WILL BE REQUIRED TO HAVE COMPLETE BEFORE YOU DO ENTRIES FOR THE FAIR.
