#### Helping 4-H Youth Thrive (2022-2023)

Volunteers who are club, project, or Clover Kid leaders, SESS leaders or assistant leaders attend an annual training that strengthens their positive youth development knowledge and skills. Training occurs in each county and is designated as the annual training module.

Learn strategies to create a positive and supportive environment for youth and develop a stronger understanding of the importance of emotional and social well-being and the impact it has on today's youth. # **Sheep and Goat Weigh-ins**

Humboldt County sheep & meat goat weigh-in is set for **Saturday, April 29th, from 9-11am**. All lambs (market, commercial, and purebred breeding) nominating for State Fair MUST have a 4-H ear tag put in and a retinal image collected at county weigh in. All meat goats (market animal and breeding doe's) must have a 4-H tag (or tattoo for doe's). Retinal images required for all State Fair meat goats, both breeding and market. Again this year Families will have to enter all their animals on their own once weigh in over, watch for more information at weigh.

#### **EAR TAGS MESSAGE:**

In preparation with Kiersten going on leave. If you know how many ear tags (breeding beef, bottle animals, swine) you will be needing please reach out to her so that she can get them ready for you. We will be doing a deposit for any tagger that is checked out from the office. The deposit will be \$15 and you will get it back once you return the tagger and you will have 24 hours to get the tagger back.



#### **Equine Extravaganza**

Equine Extravaganza provides opportunities for all youth in grades 4-12 to demonstrate their knowledge of equine-related subject matter in a competitive setting where attitudes of friendliness and fairness prevail. Depending on the event, youth can participate both as an individual and as part of a team. Held at Ellsworth Community College in Iowa Falls April 14th-16th. Registration is due March 15th.

Participatory Events – Creative Writing, Digital Story, Clothes-Crafts-Woodworking, Drawing, Painting, Poster, Model Horse, Photography, Scrapbooking are for grades 3-12. Hippology, Quiz Bowl, Horse Judging, Public Speaking and Presentations Contests are for grades 4-12

### Animal Identification – May 15th

All animals to be shown at the Humboldt County Fair, Iowa State Fair, or Clay County Fair must complete the identification process on 4-H Online before 11:59pm on May 15th( the only paper copies I will be accepting are FFA Members. Breeding Beef, Breeding Sheep, Breeding Meat Goats, Market Swine, Dairy, Dairy Goats, Horse and Pony, Dog, Bucket Bottle Animals have to be IDed by May 15th. Pets, Cat, Rabbit, Poultry (those are due June 16th with livestock entries, but check with other counties on due dates if you are planning on showing in a different county. You simply login to 4HOnline and identify your animals, at https://v2.4honline.com. Don't be afraid to reach out for help if needed, we are always available from 8-4:30 Monday—Thursday and 8-12 Fridays. What happens if you forget to login and id your animals in 4HOnline? You will not be able to exhibit those animals at any county fair. There are NO EXCEPTIONS; please don't miss this deadline.

#### 2023 Dairy Goat Share-A-Kid Opportunity

Are you looking for a new and exciting way to expand your 4-H experience? Interested in showing an animal, but don't know where to start?

Each year the Iowa Dairy Goat Association promotes interest in dairy goats across our state. One of the ways IDGA encourages young people to explore this aspect of agriculture is through their Share-A-Kid program. This statewide contest is open to youth in 4<sup>th</sup> thru 12<sup>th</sup> grades and who are a member of 4-H, FFA, IDGA, or any other agricultural group. Winning applicants are selected from an essay they submit. The essay can include drawings, photos or any other creative touches. IDGA can only award one goat per family per year; however, siblings are encouraged to apply. Previous winners are ineligible.

# Showing Swine at a County Fair?

<u>Office.</u> This is required for both 4-H/ FFA swine that will be shown at the Humboldt County Fair. When picking up ear tags information needed will be youth name and number needed for the youth. <u>Remember your animal needs to be both ear notched, and have an ear tag, both of these need to be on the swine ID for entered into 4-HOnline or paper for FFA Members by May 15th. <u>All State Fair swine must have a DNA punch tag and USDA Tag.</u> You as the family will be required to tag your own animals this year.</u>

### Fair Entries on FairEntry ~Due June 16th~

You will use your 4-H Online log in to enter your animals, it will also require you to enter your FSQA certificate number. Help sheet to be coming. Static Projects will need to be entered by this date also so me thinking of your projects early. There will be a week for late entries so those are due June 23rd, you will pay 5 times the entry for those late entries. Same process as in the past that you will use this website: to register and it will open May 16th.







Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) is a national multi-species quality assurance program for youth ages 8 to 21 (4th– 12th graders) with a focus on three core pillars: food safety, animal well-being, and character development.

YQCA will be replacing the old verification services called FSQA. YQCA certification is the new required youth quality assurance certification. If you are planning on showing any of these animals you need to complete YQCA.

- Swine
- Cattle
- Sheep
- Goats
- Rabbits
- Poultry

YQCA is available as an online program for youth, you can now view it on your own time.

The way to complete this training is it go to http://yqca.org/, sign in using your 4-H Online log in. There is a **\$12 fee per child** to go with this training (if you need financial assistance please contact the office) which is paid when you log in your child. I ask that you have your training completed by **June 1st 2023**. Once you have completed the training you will see a <u>certificate on your screen, you will then have to **email that certificate to hollyk@iastate.edu** so that I have proof you completed it.</u>
