

2019 Fair Information

Pre Entry Day (Livestock)

4-H'ers and FFA members who plan to exhibit livestock at the county fair must pre-enter in classes they wish to exhibit in. Pre Entry day is Monday, July 8th, 8:00am—6:00pm in the Community Room of the Courthouse. Pre Entry day includes beef, bucket bottle calf, dairy, swine, sheep, goat, poultry, rabbit, pet, horse, and dog. This is **mandatory** and **must be done on this day, and this day only**. Members may have someone else enter their animals for them. Be prepared with animal IDs and class numbers. Sign up for the livestock auction will also be at Pre Entry day. **Be sure to bring multiple checks (at least 3). Payment is separate for stall fees, fair fun cards, and 4-H items.**

4-H Exhibitor T-Shirts

All 4-H'ers and Clover Kids will again be receiving exhibitor t-shirts for free! Local businesses contributed monetary donations toward purchasing t-shirts for every 4-H'er in Jackson County. They will have their name and/or logo on the back of the shirts so be sure to THANK them. *T-shirts may be picked up at Pre Entry Day or at the Extension Office until July 19th.*

Fair Indoor Exhibits

Entry tags, exhibitor lists, and photography entry forms are available at the Extension Office. *4-H'ers will need an entry tag for each exhibit brought to the fair for indoor judging.* Exhibitor lists (form used to list individual classes) will need to be filled out and brought with the 4-H'er on the day of judging. Photography exhibits will need to have a photography entry form attached to the back of the picture. All canned products must have a canning label.

Wristbands

The fair admission is \$35 for the five day Fair Fun Card pass and \$12 for one day's admission. Fair Cards and wristbands for parents and volunteers can be purchased at the Extension Office. *4-H'ers and FFA members have a reduced admission fee of \$12 for members 13 years old and older at the time of fair. 4-H'ers will be able to purchase a wristband at Pre Entry Day or at the Extension Office until July 20th for only \$6.00!* The remaining \$6.00 of the fee will be paid for by the 4-H Foodstand. FFA members exhibiting at the Jackson County Fair may purchase a wristband for \$12.00.



Release of Indoor Exhibits Date/Time

For 2019, the indoor exhibits release dates is Sunday, July 28 from 6:00pm-7:00pm and Monday, July 29 from 7:30am-12:30pm. On Sunday, only exhibits that can be carried out will be allowed to be released. No vehicles will be allowed on the grounds, so you must be able to *carefully* and *safely* carry your exhibits to where ever your car is parked. Exhibits on Sunday will be released through the South door of Pearson (side door toward Boyer). On Monday, the remaining exhibits may be released.

Communication Event Schedules

4-H'ers who entered in Communication events were mailed letters with the event schedules and additional forms. If you did not receive a letter in the next 2 weeks for an event you signed up for, contact the Extension Office to get the information.

Club Booth Contest!

The purpose of the indoor booth contest is to promote Jackson County 4-H in a fun, creative, and resourceful way. When decorating their space, clubs should take into consideration what makes their club unique, why youth should join 4-H (their club specifically), as well as displaying all projects in a positive way. See page 43 in the fair book for judging criteria and other information.

State Fair Charter Bus

Take a bus to the Iowa State Fair! On Tuesday, August 13th, Jackson County 4-H will be sponsoring one to two charter busses for Share-the-Fun, Presentation and Working Exhibit participants. Two leaders/adults must accompany each Share-the-Fun group. Seats are first reserved for Communication participants. Additional riders must pay \$25.00 each at time of sign up (at County Fair). No refunds will be given.



Clothing Event Participants

Clothing Event judging will be held at the Jackson County Senior Citizens Center on Wednesday, July 10th. Participants have been sent a letter with the judging schedule. Remember—all report forms are posted online here <https://www.extension.iastate.edu/jackson/4h> under Fair Information & Forms -> Indoor Projects. Contact the Extension Office with any questions.

4-H Food Stand

Did you know that the funds raised by the 4-H Food Stand go to offset wristband costs for all 4-H members exhibiting at the fair? They also help lower prices for camps and conferences and provide scholarships that all 4-H members are eligible to apply for.

This makes it essential that each 4-H member do their part to work at the 4-H Food Stand during their scheduled time. Clubs can decide how they want to staff their assigned shift(s).

Members are asked to wear a clean 4-H shirt and clean hat (such as a baseball cap) during their shift. Please remove any jewelry while working in the Food Stand. 4-H'ers and volunteers should wear a clean white or green 4-H shirt with clean pants or shorts while working in the Food Stand.

Each 4-H member is asked to donate one pie (limit two per family) to the 4-H Food Stand. Pies must be two crust and at least 9 inches in diameter (no Sara Lee pies—they are only 8 inches). Soft pies, such as cream, pumpkin and pecan will not be accepted. Youth Committee has set a \$10 fee for 4-Hers who do not bring a pie and see that their name is checked off the list.

Any 4-H'er wanting to sell their animals at the fair must sign up during Pre Entry Day. No additions to the auction schedule will be made after July 8th. Scratches will be accepted until Saturday, July 27th at 4:00pm. Scratches must be given to Katie or Amber.

Dog Project Meetings

Meetings will be every Monday night at 6:30pm at the fairgrounds. On nights there are also Horse Project Meetings a meeting at 5:30 will also be offered. Remember, 4-H'ers must participate in at least **FOUR** Dog Project Meetings to be able to exhibit at the fair!

Horse Project Meetings

The next (and last!) horse project meeting is Tuesday, July 2nd, 6:00pm at the Fairgrounds. Remember, youth grades 4th—8th must attend and complete **TWO** full meetings/workshops, youth grades 9th—12th must attend and complete **ONE** full meeting/workshop to exhibit at the fair. There will be **NO** makeups.

Beef Project Members

There will be a **\$15 per head fee** collected on Pre-Entry day. \$15 per head will be refunded during weigh in at the fair once calves have been checked in.

Bucket Bottle Calf Interviews

Interviews will be held at the Extension Office on Pre-Entry Day, July 8th. Exhibitors who turned in their reports have been sent a letter with their interview times.

Friendly Reminder...

The deadline rule that was created in 2015 is still in place. This rule applies to ALL 4-H/FFA members. It is listed on page 3 under the General Rules section of your fair book.

"All deadlines are final. Each 4-H'er will be granted one strike for missed deadlines throughout their 4-H career. Examples include, but are not limited to: livestock ID's, pre-entry day entries, clothing event registrations. After one strike is used, and a 4-H'er misses another deadline, 4-H'er will not be able to exhibit in that project area for that specific year.

For State Fair eligibility, State Fair rules and deadlines supersede. "

Indoor Exhibit Tips...



Can't think of any ideas of what project to take to the fair this year? Start by looking at the many project areas that 4-H has to offer... you can choose one or more projects from more than *45 different areas!* There's something for everyone!!

Think about:

- an interest you'd like to explore
- A hobby you'd like to learn more about
- A topic of interest shared by you and your family
- Something that is fun for you
- Use your creativity to explore new ideas and create new projects!

Goal Cards

Don't wait until the night before judging to write your goal cards! The information may be on a 3x5 card or put together in a folder. It should be well organized and brief. Remember, beside the appearance of your actual project, what you include in your write up is demonstrating to the judge what you learned as well as your workmanship and techniques. Include what you think will support your project.

These questions **must** be included and are the same questions that the judge will ask:

1. What did you plan to learn or do? (what was your exhibit goal(s)?)
2. What steps did you take to learn or do this?
3. What were the most important things you learned?

Food & Nutrition, Photography and Visual arts classes have additional requirements.

As we prepare for fair, it is important to do some checking to make sure that you are not going to get into any copyright problems with your exhibit. Copyright is important because you don't want to take credit for something that you did not create yourself. While you are putting together an art project or some other visual arts type of exhibit, you need to make sure to site your source.

Design Elements & Art Principles for 4-H Exhibits



Elements of Design: A design is a visual plan you can use to create your 4-H project. Everything you see has a design. When you describe something you see, you use words that tell about the lines, shapes, colors, textures, and spaces. **Line, shape, color, texture, and space are the basic elements of design.**

Principles of Design: Some combinations of design elements work better than others. Some guidelines are there to help you understand why some combinations work and others do not work as well. These guidelines—**rhythm, proportion, emphasis, balance, and unity**—are the principles of design.

Be sure you are including the elements and principles in your goal write-ups if they are needed for that specific project. Tip sheets are available to help guide you along:

A good rule of thumb:

Juniors describe at least 1, Intermediates describe at least 2, Seniors describe at least 3 or more.

Design Exploring the Elements & Principles

Elements of Design
A design is a visual plan you can use to create your 4-H project. Everything you can see has a design. When you describe something you see, you use words that tell about the lines, shapes, colors, textures, and spaces. **Line, shape, color, texture, and space are the basic elements of design.**

The elements of design are important to everyone who works in textiles and clothing, home interiors, woodworking, photography, landscaping, architecture, foods, and the visual arts. If you understand the design elements, you will be more successful with your 4-H projects.

Line
Lines can be horizontal, vertical, dotted, zig-zag, curved, straight, diagonal, bold, or fine. Lines can show direction, lead the eye, outline an object, divide a space, and communicate a feeling or emotion.

Shape
Shapes are made by connecting lines. Circle, square, triangle, and freeform are words used to identify shapes. Look at the objects around you and describe their basic shapes. Are they one shape, or are they a combination of many shapes? After doing this several times, you will begin to understand what shape really is. Line creates two dimensional or flat shapes. When shapes are three dimensional, we call them forms. A circle is a shape, a ball is a form. A square is a shape, a cube is a form. A drawing is a flat shape, a sculpture is a three-dimensional form.
