

ISUE Early Care & Education Sponsored Trainings: in Jasper County

Red Flags and Referrals: Reading the Signs of Autism and Developmental Concerns

Tuesday, December 10, 6:30 —8:30 PM
DMACC, Newton Room 210 B

This two-hour workshop will highlight developmental milestones and red flags for atypical child development. It includes information of the early signs of autism, resources, and tips for sharing concerns with families.

Shaken Baby Syndrome and the Period of Purple Crying

Thursday, January 23, 6:30 —8:30 PM

This training will define Shaken Baby Syndrome. You will learn what the symptoms are of Shaken Baby Syndrome and what is the main trigger for it—CRYING! Did you know that all healthy infants go through a phase of increased crying? This is called the Period of Purple Crying.

Trainings in Poweshiek County

The Family Storyteller, Peter's Chair:

Monday, January 6, 6:30– 8:00 PM, Grinnell, Drake Community Library

This class teaches parents and caregivers basic skills for improving early literacy. In “Peter’s Chair”, participants will learn 1. being literate goes beyond reading and includes the ability to speak, listen, write and read. 2. How to help children link what they read to their own life experiences. Each Participant will receive a book!

Participants do not need to have attended prior Family Storyteller classes to attend.

Nurturing Healthy Sexual Development

Tuesday, January 14, 6:30– 8:30 PM, Grinnell, Drake Community Library

This training will help participants better understand the sexual development of children and learn how to respond to children’s sexuality in ways that is healthy. Participants will increase awareness between healthy sexuality and child abuse prevention.

The Family Storyteller, Have You Seen My Duckling?

Monday, March 3, 6:30– 8:00 PM, Grinnell, Drake Community Library

This class teaches parents and caregivers basic skills for improving early literacy. In this session, participants will learn how to 1. link pictures to words, 2. review and discuss the book, and 3. retell the story in their own words. Each participant will receive a free book!

Participants do not need to have attended prior Family Storyteller classes to attend.

Just a Bite—Managing Food Allergies in Child Care:

Tuesday, March 18, 6:30-8:30 PM, Grinnell, Drake Community Library

This training is CACFP approved. It is a new training developed and trained by ISU Extension Field Specialist. The incidence of food allergies is on the rise, increasing the chances that a child care provider will have a child with food allergies under their care. What are the most common food allergens? What are the current laws/regulations pertaining to the food labeling of potential food allergens? Learn the signs and symptoms of food allergies and common food allergies for children. Practicing altering menus to avoid food allergens and reading labels to identify food allergies.

Trainings in Marion County

The Family Storyteller #3 Brown Bear, Brown Bear What Do You See? December 2, 6:30– 8:00PM , Marion County Extension Office, Oak Room

This class teaches parents and caregivers basic skill for improving early literacy. In Session 3, Participants will learn how to 1. preview a book with children to foster excitement and engagement, 2. use prediction to increase children's imagination and problem solving skills, 3. read at a pace that allows children to participate and ask questions. Each participant will receive a free book! Participants do not need to have attended prior Family Storyteller classes to attend.

The Business of Child Care: Record-Keeping and Deductions:

**Dec. 3rd and 10th (make-up date Dec. 16th)
Marion County Extension Office, Oak Room**

This course is a 2-part series designed specifically for home providers. It is based on Tom Copeland's business principles, the author of many publications used as resources by child care providers. Participants will learn that good record-keeping is an essential part of any business. They will learn valuable information for keeping records, what are allowable tax deductions, what items can be depreciated, how to figure time-space percentages, and much more.

Participants must attend both classes to receive training credit and will receive a 2014 Calendar Keeper. Plus those attending both sessions will be eligible for a drawing for a Record Keeping Kit (valued at \$200). Follow-up coaching is available to Jasper, Marion, and Poweshiek County child care providers. We can help get your business records organized!!

Early Care & Education Training Attendance Policies

Early Care & Education Training Attendance Policies are in place to ensure all providers have fair and equal access to trainings. Prior to registering for classes, please take a moment to review the Training Attendance Policies listed below.

Check for updated trainings and register online at <https://ccmis.dhs.state.ia.us/trainingregistry/>

Registration Policy - Registration, including fee payment (if applicable) is required in advance for all Early Care & Education (ECE) sponsored training. Walk-ins are only allowed if space is available AND the facilitator gives the approval. Each person interested in attending a class must register through the Training Registry by the scheduled registration deadline listed on the Training Registry unless approved by the ECE Staff.

Online Training Registration - Training participants need to register for training online using the Iowa DHS Training Registry at <https://ccmis.dhs.state.ia.us/trainingregistry/>. If you are registering for a training that requires a fee, please note that your registration is not complete until ECE receives your payment by check, money order, or cash. Participants will be approved for the trainings in the order in which their payment is received. Be sure to read the “comment” section of all descriptions for relevant details.

Fee Collection Policy - Pre-paid registration fees (if applicable) are required no later than 1 business day prior to the beginning of the class. Class descriptions in the training calendar define fee amounts for specific classes and series training.

Refund Policy - Registration fees are non-refundable or transferable. If a class is cancelled by ECE or has been filled, compensation will be given.

Late Arrival/Early Departure Policy - Classes will begin at the published start time. Participants will not be admitted nor receive credit for class if they arrive late. Participants need to plan to arrive 10 minutes early to check in, locate facilities, and find a seat in the classroom. All registered participants will be provided with materials and the opportunity to participate in the class. Anyone leaving a class early will not receive training credit or a certificate.

Children are not allowed at Early Care & Education sponsored training –

A child age 14 - 16, who meets DHS regulations as an employee/assistant in a child care program, may attend training but should be accompanied by an adult.

Professional Behavior Policy - Class participants are expected to behave in a professional and courteous manner. Cell phones need to be set to vibrate or silent. Phone calls, text messaging, and side conversations are not allowed during class time. If an emergency call must be taken, please step outside of the classroom. ECE reserves the right to withhold a training certificate if a participant engages in unprofessional behavior that disrupts the class. Disruptive participants may be asked to leave the class. Such action will be at the discretion of the instructor, facilitator and/or ECE staff and may include notifying the participant’s employer.

Training Certificates - Maintaining training certificates is the responsibility of the participant. Training credit for class is measured in contact hours and is documented in the form of an original ECE certificate. Attendance is verified using the final attendance roster for each class and recorded on the Iowa DHS Training Registry. There is a fee for replacement certificates.
