

CLOVER KIDS FAIR PARTICIPATION

General Rules for Clover Kids

1. Open to all active Jefferson County Clover Kids. Must attend at least two Clover Kids meetings.
2. **Pre-fair entry is required by June 7th.** Entries must identify what is being exhibited.
3. Participants will receive a participation ribbon; no premium money is given for Clover Kids projects.

Clover Kids Static Project Classes 90101

1. Clover Kids will have the opportunity to discuss their showcase items with a caring adult at their assigned time on Static Project Judging Day.
2. There is no limit to the number of items entered by a Clover Kid. All items must be made by the Clover Kid under adult supervision. Items may be made at home, in school, at day care, or at camp.
3. **All showcase items will be on display at the Jefferson County Fair until Sunday, June 30th at 6:00pm.** Items should be picked up at this time.
4. The Jefferson County Extension Office and the Jefferson County Fair Board will use diligence to ensure the safety of all items entered at the Jefferson County Fair; however, we are not responsible for damage or loss by fire, theft, etc.
5. Showcase items may be in any of these categories:
 - Class A: Animals** – Showcase items related to all species and types of animals. Live animals may not be brought to the fair for this class.
 - Class B: Creative Arts** – Showcase items related to art, photography, and music.
 - Class C: Agriculture and Natural Resources** – Showcase items related to plants, agriculture, and the environment. Notice: You will be totally responsible for the care of your plants while they are at the fair.
 - Class D: Family and Consumer Science** – Showcase items related to food, clothing, or home decorating. Sewn or home-crafted items can be included in this class.
 - Class E: Personal Development** – Showcase items related to, or created by the child, such as stories, poems, etc.
 - Class F: Science, Engineering, and Technology** – Showcase items related to science, engineering, technology, or items designed and built by the child, such as wood items.
 - Class G: Other** – Showcase items not included under any of the above classes.

Clover Kids Animal Classes

General Rules:

1. Clover Kids will have the opportunity to show the audience and tell a caring adult about their animal.
2. Clover Kids may use a 4-H or FFA member's animal for the classes listed below. Clover Kids are not able to share animals with another Clover Kid.
3. Animals should be checked in for shows according to the times listed on page 15.
4. All Clover Kids' animal exhibit opportunities will be cooperative and not competitive.
5. Exhibitors must follow the fair's rules and health requirements as stated in the fair book. These include, but are not limited to, the following: no evidence of warts, ringworm, pinkeye, or other infectious conditions will be allowed; each exhibitor is responsible for showing and caring for his or her animal in partnership with a caring adult.

Pet Show Class 90201

1. Clover Kids Pet Show animals are only allowed on the fairground during the entry and show time.
2. All pets must come properly restrained or contained. Examples include on a leash, in a box, cage, or bowl.
3. Livestock animals such as swine, horses, cattle, poultry are not to be shown in the Clover Kids Pet Show. All animals must be less than 200 pounds.
4. Clover Kids and pets must be supervised by an adult at all times. The adult is responsible for both the Clover Kid and pet.
5. Cats and dogs must have a current rabies certificate. **A copy of the rabies certificate must be presented at the time of check-in.**
6. Any female animal in season cannot be shown.
7. Clover Kids may show animals in the following classes.
 - Class A. Cats
 - Class B. Dogs
 - Class C: Gerbils

Class D: Guinea Pigs

Class E: Hamsters

Class F: Mice

Class G: Turtles

Class H: Fish

Class I: Birds

Class J: Other—Please check with Extension Office for animals entered into this class.

Clover Kids Dog Show Class 90202

1. Members must attend at least two dog obedience classes offered by the dog project leader prior to county fair to be eligible for the Dog Show. Clover Kids that do not attend at least two classes can enter their dog in the Pet Show but will not have the opportunity to showcase the skills of obedience.
2. Clover Kids will have the opportunity to showcase their dog and what each of them have learned through dog obedience classes.
3. All dogs must come properly restrained on a leash.
4. Clover Kids and dogs must be supervised by an adult at all times. The adult is responsible for both the Clover Kid and dog.
5. Dogs must have a current rabies certificate. **A copy of the rabies certificate must be presented before the first dog practice.**
6. Any female in season cannot be shown.

Clover Kids Poultry Show Classes

1. Clover Kids must keep their bird on the fairgrounds all week. Cost is \$1. Pen requests and payment due June 7th.
2. Pullorum Testing will be done on Tuesday of fair.

Clover Kids Poultry Class 90203

1. Limit of two birds, either male or female.

Classroom Chickens Class 90207

1. Chickens in this class must be hatched from the Ag in the Classroom project in the Fairfield and Pekin School Districts.
2. Limit of two birds. Can be either both male, both female, or one of each.

Return Classroom Chickens Class 90208

1. Chickens in this class must be hatched from the Ag in the Classroom project in the Fairfield and Pekin School Districts before the prior year's fair.
2. Limit of two birds. Can be either both male, both female, or one of each.

Clover Kids Rabbit Show Class 90204

1. Limit of two rabbits.
2. Clover Kids have the option of keeping their rabbit on the fairgrounds all week. Cost is \$1. Pen requests and payment due June 7th.

Clover Kids Bottle-Bucket Show Classes

1. Children must be accompanied by an adult in the show ring at all times.
2. Clover Kids can borrow an older 4-H/FFA member's exhibit. The owner of the animal should accompany the Clover Kid in the ring.
3. Animal must be bucket or bottle fed.
4. Record keeping forms are encouraged to be filled out prior to the show day and are available at the Jefferson County Extension Office. The record keeping forms can be turned in at the time of the entry on the day of the show.
5. Animals will be clean, groomed, and shown on halter.
6. Children will be asked questions regarding: care and management of raising the animal, showing/handling of the animal, fitting, general health, condition of the animal, child's knowledge, appropriate record keeping.
7. Depending on number of entries, the show may be split into multiple classes.
8. Clover Kids have the option of keeping their bottle animals at the fair all week. Cost is \$10/stall. Stall requests and fees are due June 7th.

Bottle-Bucket Lambs and Goats Class 90205

1. Class is open to any newborn or orphan male or female lamb or goat, born after January 1 of current year.
2. Limit of one lamb or goat per exhibitor.
3. Lambs and goats will be shown together.

Bottle-Bucket Calves Class 90206

1. Any newborn or orphaned calf - steer, bull or heifer - dairy or beef - purebred or crossbred - calved after January 1st of the current year. Male calf may remain a bull.
2. Limit of one calf per exhibitor.
