

1 p.m. - Native Plants, Kristine Nemec, Iowa Tallgrass Prairie Center. More diverse, native, perennial vegetation is ideal for any landscape. The plants benefit wildlife, hold soil during heavy rainfall, reduce nutrient pollution and have abilities to trap and store carbon. The Tall Grass Prairie Center was established at the University of Northern Iowa (UNI) in 1999. Kristine Nemec joined the Center staff in 2015. She is the statewide coordinator for county roadside programs, providing training and education for Iowa's county roadside programs, and conducting outreach to raise awareness of the value of roadside programs. Many of the programs are accomplished through partnerships with organizations, associations, and federal,



2:15 p.m. - Community Gardening, Aaron Steils, ISU, Consumer Horticulture Extension Specialist – From selecting and growing produce to managing weeds and volunteers, Aaron will cover growing produce for donations which became a popular and a very necessary activity during the pandemic. He has worked for Iowa State University for more than 15 years. In 2021, he became the Consumer Horticulture Extension Specialist where he works with county Extension offices across the state to answer home gardening questions for all Iowans. Aaron is a frequent contributor to Iowa Public Radio Horticulture Friday, Garden Variety podcast, and Iowa PBS Gardening with Steil. Previously, Aaron worked as Assistant Director for Iowa State University's Reiman Gardens and taught Horticulture classes at Iowa State. He also



previously worked at the Iowa Arboretum; Callaway Gardens in Pine Mountain, Georgia; and the renowned Longwood Gardens in Kennett Square, Pennsylvania. He received a B.S. in Horticulture and biology from ISU and a master's degree in public horticulture from the University of Delaware.
