Downtown City Projects

Plum Grove

Plum Grove was the home of Robert Lucas, the first territorial governor of Iowa. It is staffed by the Johnson County historical society. Master Gardeners have tended the flower and vegetable gardens for over 20 years. Highlights include the Heritage party and Tomato Tasting party events during the summer.

Raptor Center

Master Gardeners maintain a hummingbird garden at the conference center of the Macbride Raptor Center and a butterfly garden next to the Prairie walk. The goal is to plant and maintain flowers and plants emphasizing natives that will attract hummingbirds and butterflies.



Solon High School

Grounds at the Solon High School, Solon Middle School and the Solon Public Library are kept looking nice by the Johnson County Master Gardeners. The garden beds give the community something to enjoy all year.





Speaker's Bureau

The Master Gardeners Speakers Bureau gives talks to community groups eager to learn anything about gardening. Topics of interest include garden set-up and take down, good vegetables to grow, low maintenance yards, hostas and growing vegetables and flowers from seed and many more!

Hospice Garden at Willow Creek Park

The Willow Creek Park project is located along the bike trail not far from Benton Street in Willow Creek Park. The site is dedicated to lowa City Hospice volunteers. The stone benches, hosta garden, roses, and springtime daffodils offer a place for quiet reflection.
