- 3. Treasurer's Report

a. General Fund: \$23,476.36b. Plum Grove: \$1,395.73c. Butterfly House: \$4,026.42

d. New or Known Pending Receipts:

- Kirkwood Scholarship Request: \$2000 (MG General), unanimously approved Amount includes two \$1000 scholarships for local students with an interest in horticulture. Jackie brought up the possibility of increasing the contribution. Shannon will follow up with Kirkwood regarding interest and need.

4. Review of JCMG Steering Committee Meeting Calendar (Doug)

- Prep for July 12 Taste of Heritage Gardens at Plum Grove; Seeds have been ordered and have arrived.
- Prep for Taste of Heritage Gardens at Plum Grove planning, Set date for meeting in May.

c. May

5. Extension Report/Announcements (Shannon)

- a. Shannon has a new title: ANR (Ag & Natural Resources) Program Coordinator. She will no longer be at the front desk. The new office will have two extra desks—one for Shannon and one for HortLine. Additional storage space is being made for MG items in the large storage room. The extension office will be receiving updates including new paint and office furniture. Patience during this transition is appreciated.
- Jillian has been hired as a marketing associate and will be housed at the front desk. Kamryn will be starting in mid-May as a second 4-H County Youth Coordinator.
- c. The Fair Board is in transition. Shannon will make sure that new people are aware of the MOU (memo of understanding) which contains the agreements between the board and Johnson County Extension and JCMG.
- d. There is no Fairgrounds groundskeeper at this time.

e. There is a fruit tree (apple) grafting class with Patrick O'Malley on April 4. A \$40 registration fee covers the cost of root stock. Each registrant may take home two grafted trees. NOTE: due to bad weather, this workshop was rescheduled to April 10.

6. New Business

- a. Fairgrounds Beautification (Raingarden and flower beds) coordinator update (Chris)
 - Chris read a prepared letter describing her concerns about the designation of co-coordinator for this project. There was discussion about whether the Raingarden will be considered part of Fairgrounds Beautification.

7. Old Business

- a. JCMG Bylaws review discussion & voting
 - Appendix B.2, Shannon presented the following proposal for determining the number of voting members of the Steering Committee:
 - There are 23 voting members. Quorum = 12+; no individual gets more than one vote.
 - Each project can only have two voting members (primary coordinator & secondary coordinator) with the exception of Plum Grove which has three garden project leaders. The two Plum Grove events fall as subcommittees of that project. If individuals decide to step up to take lead of the two Plum Grove events and come to the steering committee meetings on a regular basis the steering committee members will revisit and take a vote on whether to add them back in as individual projects rather than subcommittee status under Plum Grove. If any projects (except Plum Grove) have only a primary coordinator and would add a secondary coordinator, the secondary coordinator must be present at a steering committee meeting and have their name added to the minutes as joining the project (no vote required). Fairgrounds Beautification (Chris & Laurie) and Rain Garden (Lavon) will be considered 2 separate projects.
 - Projects will be reviewed at a later date. As part of that review if a
 project changes status from Core to Other then the status of that
 project's leaders changes as well.
 - It was moved and seconded that we vote to accept the proposal.
