2021 Sheep and Goat Weigh-In

When: May 1st, 2021 from 8 to 10 a.m. Where: Keokuk County Expo Fairgrounds

Who: Weigh-in will include ALL 4-H and FFA Expo and ALL 4-H State Fair Animals

ALL 4-H State Fair lambs—including market, commercial, purebred, and breeding—will be retinal scanned and

MUST attend county weigh-in

If you cannot attend this weigh-in, you must attend a weigh-in in another county. Contact the extension office ASAP if this is the case—arrangements must be made IN ADVANCE with the other county.



2021 Livestock Projects: Rules & Deadlines

May 15th: Deadline for ALL animals to be entered into 4-H Online

EVERY animal must be entered into 4-H Online 2.0 by MAY 15th at 11:59 p.m.!

This includes all Beef, Bucket Bottle, Swine, Sheep, Goats, Horses, Poultry, Rabbits, Dogs, Cats, and other Pets (anything with a heartbeat!). Remember that poultry does not need identification, but still must be entered online.

After this date we are NOT able to make ANY changes. Please be sure to have correct identification, including breed, tag number, sex, birthdate, etc.

Exhibitors must enter their own animal information into 4-H Online! This is a change from past years. Staff will verify information after it is entered, but cannot enter it for you.

It is the responsibility of the 4-Her to obtain, complete, and submit livestock identification on time, not the leaders or extension staff.

Remember that May 15th is a Saturday. Office staff are happy to answer questions, but please contact the office before Friday, May 14th to be sure we have plenty of time to assist you.

2021 State Fair Livestock Rules

For this year, all State Fair Swine will return home. Please read the statement below from the lowa State Fair.

"To best prepare our swine exhibitors, we want to share the following lowa State Fair swine update: At this time we have exhausted all possibilities and are unable to find a market outlet for swine exhibited at the lowa State Fair.

All swine shows at the 2021 lowa State Fair will be non-terminal; there will not be any swine loaded out for harvest. The only exception will be for the following which are scheduled to be harvested at the lowa State University Meat Lab: Grand and Reserve Grand Champion 4-H Market Hog; Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion FFA Market Hog. Please plan accordingly for your harvesting needs. More information will be forthcoming along with full entry rules, available April 1."

2021 Livestock ID/Stall Cards

Cards will be handed out to leaders at the end of April to be handed out at May meetings.

It is the responsibility of the 4-Her to complete a card for each class for each animal they are bringing to Expo. Cards will be provided to every 4-Her that is enrolled in a livestock project in 4HOnline.

Livestock cards and \$15/member livestock project fee are due to the office by July 1st. Any turned in after this deadline are subject to a \$25 late fee.
