Do you know what makes chemical reactions occur? What makes things fizz?


Did you know you can make *magnetic slime*?

Livestock / Pet Entry Stall Cards DEADLINE: July 1st, 2021

- Entry cards and fees are required to be turned in at the Keokuk
 Co. Extension and Outreach Office
- <u>All</u> Livestock (including rabbits, dogs, and pets) will be required to fill out an <u>Livestock Entry Card</u>.
- There is also a \$15 stall/cage fee.
- Each class will have a number associated with it and you will be required to enter animals into their designated classes (animal's tag number and class number for each class the animal will be in). Class numbers can be found in the Expo Book.
- There is a \$25 fee for Livestock Entry Cards returned after July
 1st!

Market Animal Scanning

- Market Sheep & Beef <u>can</u> be back scanned for carcass contest! Market Hogs <u>have</u> to be scanned for carcass contest.
- There will be a charge for all animals scanned. This charge will be taken off your carcass checks. Please keep this in mind when entering animals into the carcass contest!

Scanning Cost: Cattle = \$15/h / Swine = \$7/h / Sheep = \$7/h

- We will <u>not</u> be sending any animals to market, so you will need to take your animals home after Expo!
- ♦ BREEDING ANIMALS ARE NOT ELIGIBLE FOR ENTRY IN THE CARCASS CONTEST. IF YOU SCAN A BREEDING ANIMAL, YOU <u>WILL</u> BE CHARGED!

- You must have a drug affidavit at weigh in.
- Cattle must be present by 9:00 am.

- Pen of 3 will be show first at pens. Please have correct stall cards!
- Rate of gain will be given to you on a sticker to place on your shirt as you enter the ring.



RABBIT

ORANGE stall card due July 1st

Check-in: Wednesday, July 14th from 11:00 am -12:00 pm

Please be at your pens!

Show: Wednesday, July 15th at 6:00 pm following the poultry show

SWINE



CREAM stall card due July 1st

Weigh in: Wednesday, July 14th from 10:00-11:30 am

- You must have a drug affidavit at weigh in.
- Hogs must be unloaded/penned on the north side of the Livestock Barn before 10:00 am. <u>No</u> hogs will be allowed to weigh from the trailer.
- Class entry sheets must be turned in by 2:00 pm.

 Rate of gain will be given to you on a sticker to place on your shirt as you enter the ring.

DAIRY CATTLE & DAIRY GOAT



Stall card due July 1st

- Dairy cattle show first
- All dairy goats must be identified with an individual Scrapie Flock of Origin ID tag.



HORSE & PONY

- Show will begin with halter and showmanship classes first, followed by riding classes and timed events/games.
- Exhibitors must wear blue jeans and a white long-sleeved shirt with collar and a 4-H or FFA armband or chevron. Hard soled boots/shoes are required.



9:30-10:30 am = Patriotic Panthers, Riverside, & Hot Shots

10:30-11:30 am = Stick to It, Liberty Leaders, & Sewing Club

*This time is non-negotiable

All exhibits **MUST** be registered by 11:30 am.

Please arrive **no more than 10 minutes early** for your club's designated judging time slot.

You will not be checked in before your club's time slot!
