

Swine Weigh-In
Saturday, March 25th, 2023
8am-10am
at the Keokuk County Fairgrounds

- Only swine that are going to show in the Derby or Farm Class in the 2023 Swine Show must attend weigh-in. However, all swine will need to be ear notched and tagged. We encourage all swine exhibitors to bring their swine to weigh-in
- If you plan to attend swine weigh-in be on the look out for a sign-up sheet.
- All swine need to have 4-H or FFA tags in their ears.
- Derby pigs can have a maximum beginning weight of 75lbs. No Exceptions!
- A maximum of 10 swine per exhibitor may be weighed in.
- State Fair DNA tagging will cost \$9.00 per swine. You may pay at weighin or the office can bill you after weigh-in.
- Families who will be DNA tagging swine for State Fair on their own need to contact the Extension Office to arrange a time to pick up DNA tags, envelope, and tagging supplies. These families need to return the DNA samples to the Extension Office by May 6th, 2023.
- All new members/families need to turn in an origin premise ID number, origin farm name, and origin address to the Extension Office by May 15th, 2023.
- Any purebred animal showing at Expo Fair needs to turn in a copy of the registration papers at the time of weigh-in or to the Extension Office.

#### Please read the important information below!

- ALL Sheep and Goats <u>MUST</u> attend weigh-in
- Weigh-In will include ALL 4-H and FFA County and State Fair animals.
- All State Fair lambs will be retinal scanned and MUST attend weigh-in.
- State Fair scanning is \$8.00 per animal for in county.
- If a truck load has multiple exhibitors' animals in it, please weigh-in all animals for the first exhibitor before moving to the next exhibitor's animals.
- If you cannot attend this weigh-in, you must attend in another county. Contact the Extension Office so we can make arrangements with another county.
- All families are required to enter their sheep/goat information in 4-HOnline by May 15th, 2023. No Exceptions! This is only 9 days after weigh-in!
- Any purebred animal showing at Expo Fair needs to turn in a copy of registration at weigh-in or to the Extension Office by July 1st, 2023.
- A maximum of eight goats per exhibitor can be weighed in for county and out of county events, but no more than two per class.
- You may nominate 6 lambs for a pen with a minimum of 2 and up to 4 returning to Expo.
- All goats and sheep must have a 4-H/FFA tag and an official USDA Scrapie tag.

Beef...Dairy Cattle or Goat... Meat Goat... Poultry... Rabbit... Sheep...Swine

- Coupon Codes will be available from the Keokuk County Extension Office in January.
   The codes will be given to 4-H leaders to give out to their club members.
- YQCA certifications are due to the Keokuk County Extension Office by June 1st, 2023 for all 4-H and FFA livestock exhibitors (beef, dairy cattle or goat, meat goat, poultry, rabbit, sheep, and swine).
- Once you have your code:
- 1. Go to https://yqcaprogram.org/
- 2. Sign-in with either 4-HOnline or (FFA only) a new profile.
- 3. Select the member taking the course.
- 4. Select age of youth in 2023
- 5. Pay (enter code)
- 6. Send a PDF version of your Certificate of Completion to Joselyn at jrabell@iastate.edu or drop a copy off to the Keokuk County Extension Office by June 1st, 2023.
- Coupons expire June 1st
- You can check your certification status on 4-HOnline at https://v2.4honline.com
- Tests may be taken multiple times. You must wait 1 hour between tests.
- Once passed, you are certified until the following year!

### Tested Vanilla Buttercream Recipe Required for use with Iowa 4-H Fair Food Product Exhibits.

(All Iowa 4-Hers must reference and attach this blog to their write-up for full credit if a homemade frosting is used in the exhibit. Any change or addition of ingredients will be unacceptable and will result in disqualification.)

1 cup unsalted butter, slightly softened

4 cups powdered sugar

1/4 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

2 Tablespoons **dairy** milk (skim, 2%, or whole)

Beat the butter, salt, and vanilla together until fully combined on medium speed. Reduce speed and add the powdered sugar and milk. Add the milk a teaspoon at a time to achieve the right consistency for the way you want to use the frosting. DO NOT use more than 2 tablespoons of milk. Slowly increase the speed of the mixer and beat until the frosting is light and fluffy.










### **Natalie Axmear**
