

Swine Weigh-In
Saturday, March 23rd, 2024
8am-10am
at the Keokuk County Fairgrounds

- Only swine that are going to show in the Derby or Farm Class in the 2024 Swine Show **must** attend weigh-in. However, all swine will need to be ear notched and tagged. We encourage all swine exhibitors to bring their swine to weigh-in.
- If you plan to attend swine weigh-in, please sign-up for a timeslot at <a href="https://go.iastate.edu/14REAP">https://go.iastate.edu/14REAP</a> or scan the QR code.
- All swine need to have 4-H or FFA tags in their ears.
- Derby pigs can have a maximum beginning weight of 75lbs. No Exceptions!
- A maximum of 10 swine per exhibitor may be weighed in.
- State Fair DNA tagging will cost \$9.00 per swine. You may pay at weigh-in or the office can bill you after weigh-in.
- Families who will be DNA tagging swine for State Fair on their own need to pick up DNA tags, envelope, and tagging supplies from the extension office. These families need to return the DNA samples to the Extension Office by May 1st, 2024. If not, families will be in charge of shipping their own samples.
- All new members/families need to turn in an origin premise ID number, origin farm name, and origin address to the Extension Office by May 15th, 2024.
- Any purebred animal showing at Expo Fair needs to turn in a copy of the registration papers at the time of Expo weigh-in or to the Extension Office by July 1.

#### Please read the important information below!

- ALL Sheep and Goats MUST attend weigh-in
- Weigh-In will include ALL 4-H and FFA County and State Fair animals.
- All State Fair lambs will be retinal scanned and MUST attend weigh-in.
- State Fair scanning is \$5.00 per animal for in county.
- If a truck load has multiple exhibitors' animals in it, please weigh-in all animals for the first exhibitor before moving to the next exhibitor's animals.
- If you cannot attend this weigh-in, you must attend in another county. Contact the Extension Office so we can make arrangements with another county.
- All families are required to enter their sheep/goat information in 4-HOnline by May 15th,
   2024. No Exceptions! <u>This is only 11 days after weigh-in!</u>
- Any purebred animal showing at Expo Fair needs to turn in a copy of registration at weigh
  -in or to the Extension Office by July 1st, 2024.
- A maximum of 8 goats per exhibitor can be weighed in for county and out of county events, but no more than two per class.
- You may nominate 6 lambs for a pen with a minimum of 2 and up to 4 returning to Expo.
- All goats and sheep must have a 4-H/FFA tag and an official USDA Scrapie tag.

### Tested Vanilla Buttercream Recipe Required for use with Iowa 4-H Fair Food Product Exhibits.

(All Iowa 4-Hers must reference and attach this blog to their write-up for full credit if a homemade frosting is used in the exhibit. Any change or addition of ingredients will be unacceptable and will result in disqualification.)

- 1 cup unsalted butter, slightly softened
- 4 cups powdered sugar
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 Tablespoons dairy milk (skim, 2%, or whole)

Beat the butter, salt, and vanilla together until fully combined on medium speed. Reduce speed and add the powdered sugar and milk. Add the milk a teaspoon at a time to achieve the right consistency for the way you want to use the frosting. DO NOT use more than 2 tablespoons of milk. Slowly increase the speed of the mixer and beat until the frosting is light and fluffy.
