Record Books

The purpose of 4-H record keeping is to teach how to keep records, which is an important life skill. Record keeping is an ongoing process that does not end when the 4-H year ends. Youth are encouraged to select from a variety of alternatives to meet their individual record keeping needs and learning styles

Objectives for 4-H Record Keeping

- To learn how to set goals, how to make plans for action, and how to decide how well you did (evaluation).
- To learn the skills of record keeping and organization to use now and in the future.
- To learn to communicate and summarize.
- To learn responsibility by completing a task.
- To evaluate information that will market personal skills through future resumes and application forms.

Completing your record book will take some time and energy, but it also provides you the opportunity to see how you have reached your goals!

Each record book needs to contain the following:

- Cover Sheet
- Yearly 4-H Summary
- Project Records
- Livestock Records
- Member Self-evaluation

2021 4-H Hall of Fame







Joan Colbert of Keokuk County was inducted into the 2021 lowa 4-H Hall of Fame during a ceremony at the 4-H Exhibits Building at the lowa State Fair on Sunday, Aug. 22. Ninety-eight lowa counties participated this year and selected 129 inductees for their outstanding service and dedication to 4-H. Inductees or their surviving family members were presented a certificate by the lowa 4-H Foundation President, David Huser, State 4-H Program Leader, Debbie Nistler, as they were introduced on stage.

Joan was a co-leader for the Keokuk Kookies 4-H Club with Irene Cassens from 1975-1985. Joan has also been a member of the Keokuk County Expo Board since 1991.

Joan has played an important role in making the Expo a success every year for 4-H and FFA members in Keokuk County. She had an intricate role in getting the kitchen and concession stand set up for the board and making it what it is today. Joan has spent countless hours at the fairgrounds and her home fixing and finessing recipes to be used. She knows how to manage money and can stretch a dollar to ensure that the Expo creates an outstanding fair every year. Joan enjoys sharing her time and expertise with others on the board and in the community.

Growing up on a family farm along the Keokuk-lowa county line allowed Joan to attend school in Webster before its closing. After the closing of the Webster school, Joan attended school in North English, Iowa. In 1959, Joan was united in marriage with Jimmy Colbert. Together, they had four children: Diana, Patricia, Pamela, and Frank. Joan is also a grandmother to nine grandkids and three great grandkids, with one on the way.

Joan previously was employed by the Manor House in Sigourney, Iowa for 15 years. This is where she gained her knowledge for food and the food ordering process. Outside of being a member of the Keokuk County Expo Board, Joan enjoys gardening, baking, playing bingo and bowling.

Counties select inductees for their exceptional work in contributing to the lives of 4-H members and the overall 4-H program. Many inductees serve as club leaders, youth mentors, fair superintendents or fair board members, lowa State University Extension and Outreach county council members, county youth council members, fair judges, financial supporters, chaperones or ISU Extension and Outreach staff members. The inductees have demonstrated dedication, encouragement, commitment and guidance to lowa's 4-H'ers through the years.

"We are honored to recognize these special individuals, for their advocacy and dedication to the Iowa 4-H program," shared Iowa 4-H Foundation Executive Director, Emily Saveraid.

"This is a great way to honor the volunteers and staff across the state of lowa that generously give their time and talents to foster positive partnerships with our 4-H youth," said Tillie Good, lowa 4-H staff and volunteer development manager.

The lowa 4-H Hall of Fame was initiated in 2002 to help commemorate the 100th anniversary of 4-H.
