4-H Outstanding Character Award Descriptions

AWARD	OBJECTIVE: To Recognize ...
Outstanding Senior	...a 4-H member who has excelled in leadership, service to 4-H, Church and community, and in his or her unselfish concern for other people and has finished 9 th -12 th grade.
Outstanding Intermediate	...an intermediate 4-H'er who demonstrates significant accomplishments through 4-H projects and involvement in club, community and county 4-H activities and has finished 6 th -8 th grade.
Outstanding Junior	...a junior 4-H member who demonstrates accomplishments through 4-H projects and involvement in club, community and county 4-H activities and has finished 4 th or 5 th grade.
Ak-Sar-Ben	...a 4-H member who is making significant progress toward maturity through his/her service for the advancement of the 4-H program in the county or area.
Danforth "I Dare You"	...two 4-H members who have demonstrated four-fold personal development and leadership.
Achievement	...young people who have shown outstanding personal growth through participation in a variety of 4-H projects and programs.
Personal Development	...those 4-H members whose accomplishments reflect significant personal growth, active citizenship, earned club and community leadership, competency in project work and unselfish service to 4-H members and others.
Overall Citizenship	...young people who have learned the meaning of citizenship and have demonstrated their understanding through good citizenship practices in all avenues your community and your 4-H life.
Overall Leadership	...young people who have acquired and demonstrated leadership skills and abilities in all avenues of your community and 4-H life.
Agriculture	...young people who have grown personally through participation in a <u>variety</u> of agricultural projects and programs.
