

## 2020 Lee County 4-H/FFA Junior Show: Important Dates:

- **June 25- FairEntry Deadline** to enter all projects both static and livestock into FairEntry.com. Here is the link: <https://lee-county.fairentry.com>
- **June 30, July 1, July 2-** Scale is open from 8:30 am to 4:00 pm at the fairground for families to help declare weights for sheep, meat goats, market beef, derby beef, market swine and breeding swine. Please contact Lee County Extension with your weights.
- **July 1- Auction Photo Deadline.** Exhibitors must submit a photo and Steffes Auction Sheet for each of your animals (meat goat, sheep, cattle and swine) in the auction to [leecountyfair@steffesgroup.com](mailto:leecountyfair@steffesgroup.com). Please note that the exhibitor must be in proper show attire (4-H/FFA shirt), in a clean environment with a clean animal.
- **July 2 - Competitive Swine and Bucket Bottle Calf Record Book Deadline.** All record books must be turned in before 4:30 pm.
- **July 2- Drug Affidavits (Market Disclosure forms) Deadline.** All animals that intend on going to market must have a drug affidavit turned into the Lee County Extension Office by 4:30 pm in the drop box at the front of the building. All exhibitors either received these forms in the packets at weigh in or ear tag pick-up. If you have lost your forms, please see our Prepare for Fair page on the Lee County Extension website. - **July 6- Declared Weight Deadline** for all sheep, meat goats, market beef, derby beef, market swine and breeding swine. Please contact the Lee County Extension Office at 319-835-5116 with your declared weights by 4:30 pm.
- **July 6- Bucket Bottle Calf Interviews** at 9:00 am and **Competitive Swine Interviews** at 1:00 pm.

**Junior Show Events:** All livestock will come and leave the same day as their respective shows.

\*\*\* Please note that all livestock will be allowed on the fairgrounds 2 hours before their respective shows, but will be required to be there 1 hour before the show for vet checks. \*\*

- **Thursday, July 9-**
  - **Fowl Show**
    - 7:00 am- fowl allowed on fairgrounds
    - 8:00 am- all fowl will be required to be on the fairgrounds for vet checks.
    - 9:00 am- Fowl Show starts
  - **Sheep/Meat Goat Show**
    - 2:00 pm- sheep and meats allowed on fairgrounds
    - 3:00 pm- all sheep and meats will be required to be on fairgrounds for vet check
    - 4:00 pm- Sheep/Meat Goat Show starts
- **Friday, July 10-**
  - **Swine Show**
    - 7:00 am- 9:00 am- Competitive Swine and Rate of Gain Weigh-in
    - 8:00 am -all other swine will be allowed to be on the fairgrounds
    - 9:00 am- all swine will be required to be on the fairgrounds for vet checks
    - 10:00 am- Swine Show starts
- **Saturday, July 11**
  - **Beef/Bucket Bottle Calf Show**
    - 7:00 am- cattle allowed on fairgrounds
    - 8:00 am- all cattle will be required to be on the fairgrounds for vet checks
    - 9:00 am- Beef/Bucket Bottle Calf Show starts
  - **Rabbit Show**
    - 12:00 pm- rabbits allowed on fairgrounds
    - 1:00 pm- all rabbits will be required to be on fairgrounds for vet checks
    - 2:00 pm- Rabbit Show starts
- **Sunday, July 12**
  - **Horse Show**
    - 8:30 am- all horses will be required to be on the fairgrounds
    - 9:00 am- Horse Show will start
