

2022-2023 4-H Enrollment

Enrollment for Returning Members due JAN. 1, 2023



Calling all 4-H members and volunteers: If you have not yet enrolled in 4-H online yet, please do so as soon as possible!



In order to be eligible to exhibit at Southern Iowa Fair in 2023, <u>enrollment in 4-H Online 2.0 and program fee must be PAID by Jan.1 2023</u> for all previously enrolled Mahaska County 4-H <u>members.</u> New 4-H members have until May15th, 2023.



Enrollment is open via 4-H Online 2.0 Sign In (4honline.com) All enrollments; including Clover Kids, 4-H Members, and Leaders needs to be entered in 4-H Online this year.

There is an annual program fee of \$35 to enroll in 4-H. But thanks to Mahaska County Farm Bureau, 4-H members will only have to pay \$30 for enrollment because Farm Bureau is donating a \$5 scholarship for each 4-H member!

Also new this year, we will be accepting online payments for 4-H enrollment. We are STRONGLY ENCOURAGING all families to pay their enrollment fees online when they enroll. When entering your enrollment there will be a section for fees. At this point, you will need to enter a credit card. If you submit your enrollment with out entering a credit card you will have to submit cash or check. Cash or check payments should be submitted to the Extension Office via mail, mailbox, or in-person. Please indicate the child you are paying for. We have many outstanding enrollments. Please make sure to pay your 4-H membership dues as soon as possible. Once we receive your payment, your enrollment will be approved. Information on how to pay online can be found on page 7 of Family Enrollment Guide linked above.

If you feel that this fee would constitute an undue financial burden, financial aid is available from the Mahaska County 4-H Foundation. Please contact the Mahaska Extension Office for assistance.



2022 Beef Weigh-in

December 10, 2022 from 8:00-10:30am



Inclement weather date is Saturday, December 17 from 8:00-10:30AM. In case of inclement weather, watch for email, text, and check our 4-H Facebook page.

Location: Fairgrounds Scale (Pull in on SOUTH side, go behind sheep & beef barns)

Cost: County Fair Verification \$4.00/head (tag) | State Fair Verification: \$9.00/head (retinal scan and tag)

Beef Class Options: Exhibitors are responsible for signing up for classes at this weigh-in.

Carcass Beef—Exhibitors may enter a max of two animals; however, a list of names was taken several months ago due to locker availability. Those who are on the reservation list will be given slots that were requested. If anyone no longer needs their slot, please let Dustin know. Currently, the spots are FULL and you can be added to a waitlist. Please contact Dustin at 673-5841 if you wish to be added to the wait list.

Advanced Feeder Pens— 2-5 head of cattle per pen, more than one pen per exhibitor is acceptable. Monthly records must be kept and submitted to the Extension office.

Return Bucket/Bottle— All Return B/B entries must have been exhibited by a Mahaska County 4-H or FFA member at the 2022 Southern Iowa Fair in the 4-H/FFA Bucket/Bottle Calf Show. Open Bucket/Bottle Calves are not eligible to be exhibited as Return Bucket/Bottle Animals since they were not part of the 4-H/FFA program in 2022 (even if the exhibit was in Clover Kids).

No Fit Beef— Open to Heifers & Steers, animals cannot be clipped at all between weigh-in and county fair.

Mahaska County Market Beef— Open to any Mahaska County born & raised heifer or steer

Market Steer—Open to any market steer, will be shown by end weight

Market Heifer—Open to any market heifer, will be shown by end weight

The Superintendents request that all calves coming to the December weigh-in have some type of halter on for safety of all in attendance at the weigh-in.

Animal Identification: Due February 1, 2022. Youth are responsible for making sure their ID forms are complete and correct before leaving the weigh-in site. FAMILIES will enter the animal information into 4-H Online. This is for county and state fair animals. Families have until February 1, 2022 to enter their animal identification(s) into 4-H Online. The county 4-H staff will double-check the entries and contact families if something doesn't match up. This also means that families will input registration numbers/breed information into the system by February 1. "Pending" for the registration number blank is not acceptable (state fair beef). 2022 Beef Weigh-in (cont.)

Iowa State Fair: All breed information and registration numbers for market beef must be in 4hOnline by February 1, no exceptions. All heifers going to the Iowa State Fair must have tattoos plus one of the following: registration # if purebred, calfhood vaccine #, or 4-H tag.

Breeding Heifer Information: Breeding Heifers must either have a tattoo or 4-H tag and be identified by the families in 4hOnline (paper ID for FFA only) by May 15. Iowa State Fair Breeding Beef must have all breed and registration information entered by the family in 4hOnline by May 15. Tattoos/tags will not be checked until fair check-in.

YQCA for Livestock Exhibitors



YQCA stands for Youth for the Quality Care of Animals and is required for 4-H & FFA members exhibiting Poultry, Rabbits, Sheep, Beef, Dairy, Swine, Meat Goat, & Myotonic Goat. It is not required for Bucket/Bottle, Llama/Alpaca, or Horse project exhibitors.

YQCA is an online training that can be completed at home or at the Extension office (by appointment). Cost to take the online training is **\$12.00 each year**. Those who complete a financial aid application at the Extension office will automatically receive a coupon code to use.

YQCA must be completed by <u>JULY 1</u> for members to be eligible to exhibit livestock at the county and/or state fair. The YQCA online program includes three components for each topic (food safety, animal well-being, and character development): 1) knowledge building, 2) skills lab, 3) quiz for each content topic, and are designed specifically for each age group. The online program is very interactive, bright, colorful, relatable, and fun!

4-H Club Attendance Policy

Mahaska County has a 75% attendance policy in place for 4-H members of community and special-interest clubs. Members attending at least 75% of their clubs' meetings, activities, and/or preapproved 4-H experiences will have eligibility to exhibit at the county fair. Clubs can set their own parameters within the 75% policy. We recommend if members are part of an *additional* special interest club, like Honor Council, that their attendance is combined for both to count toward the 75%.

Reasonable Accommodation Practice

REASONABLE ACCOMMODATION PRACTICES As part of its duties under the Americans with Disabilities Amendments Act of 2008 ("ADAAA") and the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, Iowa State University Extension and Outreach will provide reasonable accommodations to its "policies, practices, or procedures" when the accommodations are necessary to provide equal access to programming to participants with a qualifying disability. It will also provide auxiliary aids and services when they are necessary to provide equal access. The process has the following five stages: (1) completion of the Reasonable Accommodation Request and Healthcare Provider Disability Documentation forms, (2) participants and parents are sent an agenda for the eligibility team meeting, (3) the eligibility meeting is conducted, (4) a determination letter is sent to participants, and (5) possible reassessment for future events. - May 15: All other animals must be entered in 4-H online to be eligible for the 2023 Southern Iowa Fair
- May 15: Last day for any project changes in 4-H online and enrollment is due for all New Members
- May 15: Mahaska County Code of Conduct forms due (only signed once in a 4-H career)

- July 1: ALL Southern Iowa Fair Registrations are due via Fair Entry.
- July 1: YQCA Certificate due to the Mahaska County Extension Office
