2019 Southern Iowa Fair

Planning to exhibit at the 2019 Southern Iowa Fair? NOW is the time to prepare yourself. Please do not wait until the last minute. Being prepared for the county fair is the best thing you can do to have an enjoyable fair experience!

Monday, July 15

Non-Livestock 4-H Exhibit Judging will be held on Monday, July 15 in the Exhibit Hall and 4-H Building from 8:30-2:30 PM. This judging is also referred to as Static Exhibit Judging. Please see your 4-H & FFA Fair Rule Booklet on pages 40-51 for full class descriptions and more details about preparing exhibits for the fair. Several livestock weigh-ins and check-ins will also take place on Monday, July 15, so please check out the schedule on page 9 of this newsletter. If you are involved in several fair events, please check the schedule and create your own family schedule for fair week, #organization! Additionally, the Llama and Dog Shows will take place on Monday.

Tuesday, July 17

4-H Horticulture Judging will take place in the 4-H Building between 2:00-4:00 PM. Full details can be found on pages 52-53 of the 4-H & FFA Fair Rule Booklet.

Clover Kids Corner

Registration for the Summer Fun Day is now closed. The Clover Kids Summer Fun Day will be held on **Friday, June 21** from **9:00 AM-4:00 PM** in the Auditorium of the Extension office and at the fairgrounds, weather permitting.

Clover Kids are eligible to participate in the Southern Iowa Fair. They may bring up to 5 exhibits in the Exhibit Hall, Pets in the Pet Show, and a Dog in the Dog Show (must complete the required 4-H & Clover Kids Dog Classes to be eligible). Dogs must have been pre-registered in 4hOnline Animal Identification by May 15.

Clover Kids will receive tickets to the Key Coop BBQ and Chamber & Farm Bureau BBQ during the Summer Fun Day. If you are unable to attend the Summer Fun Day and plan to exhibit at the fair, please contact Ashtin for additional details and to request BBQ tickets.

Clover Kids Judging & Hall Monitoring

Clover Kids have their own assigned exhibit judging time during the Southern Iowa Fair. Clover Kids may bring their exhibits (no more than 5) to the Exhibit Hall on **Monday, July 15** for judging from 2:00-3:00 PM. Clover Kids must wear a Clover Kids shirt for exhibit judging. If you need an additional shirt, a limited quantity of various sizes are available at the Extension office for \$15.00 each. Clover Kids shirts must be worn for exhibit judging, Dog Show, and Pet Show. All Clover Kids exhibiting at the fair will receive a special participation ribbon. Exhibits will remain on display in the Exhibit Hall for the duration of the fair and can be removed from display between 8:00-9:00 PM on Saturday, July 20 or between 1:00-3:00 PM on Sunday, July 21.

Clover Kids members, leaders, and parents are asked to cover a shift for monitoring the Exhibit Hall/4-H Building.

It is the responsibility of the 4-H family to read these requirements and abide by the rules set by the county and state 4-H program.

Poultry Exhibitor Information

Pullorum Testing is required to be completed prior to the fair. Currently, Pullorum Testing is scheduled for **Saturday, June 15** between **9:00-11:00 AM** on the Southern Iowa Fairgrounds. This excludes doves and pigeons. Cost is 25¢ per bird. There is a nationwide shortage of pullorum antigen, so this testing may either be postponed or cancelled. We will post on Facebook and email those on our Poultry ID list once we know more about obtaining the antigen. Horse Project Information

Every 4-H & FFA member who plans to exhibit horses, ponies, or mules at the 2019 Southern Iowa Fair must complete at least 1 *clinic and 2 *ride nights to gain eligibility to exhibit at the county fair.

The first Tuesday of each month, starting in April, will be a Mahaska County 4-H Horse Clinic. The third Tuesday of each month, starting in April, will be a Mahaska County 4-H Horse Ride Night. Youth must bring horses and ride for the Ride Night to count. Clinics and Ride Nights will be held at the Outdoor Arena on the Southern Iowa Fairgrounds, unless otherwise noted. Clinics and Ride Nights will begin at 6:30 p.m.

* Approved ride nights must be offered by the Mahaska County 4-H Horse Superintendents, Mahaska County Saddle Club Fun Show, or Mahaska County Saddle Club Barrel Series. Exhibitors MUST ride horses for these to count as a Ride Night. Photos of exhibitors riding at the Mahaska County Saddle Club events must be submitted to the 4-H Horse Superintendent group at the addresses above.

Bucket/Bottle Animal Packets

Project packets must be completed for Bucket/Bottle animals and are available at the Extension office and on our website at <https://www.extension.iastate.edu/mahaska/page/livestock-exhibiting-information>. We have recently revised the Bottle Lamb & Goat packet. All bucket/bottle animals must have been identified in 4hOnline on May 15, 2019. You may have identified more than one bucket/bottle animal, but may only exhibit one of each at the fair. All Bucket/Bottle animal packets (along with 2 black & white copies) are due to the Extension office by 4:30 p.m. on Friday, July 5th. **Bottle Lambs and Goats did not need to attend the weigh-in this year.**

Horse Vet Check Options

Thursday, July 11—Optional Pre-Fair Vet Check 6:30 PM

This vet check will be held at the Southern Iowa Fairgrounds. Horses will be checked by a vet and Official Health Papers will be provided free of charge. Papers will be good for county and state fair (if needed). Exhibitors taking part in this option will be able to arrive at the fair and check in with the 4-H horse superintendents, since they have already been checked by a vet.

Tuesday, July 16—Fair Check-in 4:00-6:00 PM

Horses will be checked (trailer to trailer—park to the west of the Horse Barns) by an Official Fair Veterinarian. Horses can stand outside of the trailer, but may not check into stalls until the vet has checked them over. Exhibitors may use the wait time to bring tack, bedding, etc. to the stalls. Official Health Papers will not be issued.

Alternate Options

Families may schedule an appointment with their own vet (within 30 days of fair) to receive Official Health Papers and present those papers to the 4-H Horse Superintendents at fair check-in.

YQCA for Livestock Exhibitors

We are now using YQCA (Youth for the Quality Care of Animals) for all livestock exhibitors—**4-H & FFA**. YQCA is required for anyone planning to exhibit Poultry, Rabbits, Sheep, Beef, Dairy, Swine, Myotonic Goats, or Meat Goats. It is not required for Bucket/Bottle animals, Dog, Llama, Horses, or Pets.

Those who are certified for the FSQA Test are good until the current test certification expires. Once that date expires, exhibitors must complete YQCA online. YQCA is an online training that can be completed at home or at the Extension office (by appointment). Cost to take the online training is \$12.00 each year. Those who complete a financial aid application at the Extension office will automatically receive a coupon code to use.

YQCA must be completed by **JULY 1** for members to be eligible to exhibit livestock at the county and/or state fair. The YQCA online program includes three components for each topic (food safety, animal well-being, and character development): 1) knowledge building, 2) skills lab, 3) quiz for each content topic, and are designed specifically for each age group. The online program is very interactive, bright, colorful, relatable, and fun! More information can be found at <http://yqca.org/about/curriculum>.

The Beef Superintendents would like to remind you to be on the lookout for warts and/or ringworm. If you're needing help with a remedy, please contact a Beef Superintendent. Also, don't forget that No Fit calves cannot be clipped prior to fair. If they have been clipped, they can be shown at the fair but will be moved to the market steer or commercial heifer class.

Communications Event Entry Due 6/14!

Do you enjoy giving presentations, interacting with and teaching kids, or sharing your talents? Then you should sign up for the Communications Event! This event is open to ANY Mahaska County 4-H member. The registration deadline is **Friday, June 14**. The entry form can be found at the Extension office and online at:

Categories include:

Share-the-Fun—Share a talent or skill (play an instrument, share a prose, dance, sing, do a skit, etc.); can be done as an individual, pair, or group

Educational Presentation—Share your knowledge with others by giving an on-stage presentation about a topic of your choice. Presentations can include posters or *electronic visual aids (video, Powerpoint, etc.); can be done as an individual, pair, or small group. *Please check in advance with the Extension office to make sure your electronics are compatible with the projector.

Working Exhibit—Teach others how to do something. This is an interactive educational exhibit that is done at tables (not on stage). Exhibits can be done as an individual, pair, or small group.

Extemporaneous Speaking—Prepare and give an educational speech about a selected topic (prepared and shared during the fair). This category is only open to 4-H'ers who have completed 9th-12th grade.

Sheep & Goat Scrapie Tag Requirements

IF YOU ARE GOING TO EXHIBIT SHEEP AND/OR GOATS AT THE SOUTHERN IOWA FAIR, PLEASE READ THOROUGHLY!

Animals arriving at the fair without scrapie tags in place will not be permitted to be exhibited!

Sheep & Goats (Meat, Dairy, Myotonic) -

All sexually intact sheep must have an individual Scrapie Flock of Origin identification tag (Ex. IA] 234-5678) or another official Scrapie tag. All sexually intact goats must be identified with an individual Scrapie Flock of Origin identification tag (Ex. IA 1234-5678), another official Scrapie tag, or by an official tattoo registered with USDA (to register, call 1-866-USDA-TAG; 1-866-873-2824). Wethers less than 18 months of age are required to have an individual identification and a scrapie tag may be used, but a scrapie tag is not required, unless going through the auction at the fair.

Livestock Drug Affidavits

The Livestock Affidavits are the Iowa 4-H Animal Care and Management Disclosure Statements (records of your animal's medication/treatments). **These forms are due by no later than 10:00 AM on Friday, July 19 in the FAIR BOARD OFFICE at the fairgrounds.** These forms are required for 4-H & FFA animals in the following species:

Poultry, Rabbit, Market Lambs, Beef, Swine, Meat Goats, and Horses ONLY. Horse Affidavits can be turned in at the Vet Check prior to fair or during fair check-in. Animals will not be permitted to sell in the Fair Auction without this form! Auction Verification at Fair

4-H & FFA Youth Shows Sponsorship

The Southern Iowa Fair is quickly approaching and our 4-H and FFA members are working very hard to complete their projects and create exhibits to be judged at the county fair. To provide a quality experience for the youth, we hire judges with experience and training in youth development for our exhibiting classes. The judges that we hire come at a price and we are in need of 4-H and FFA Fair Judge Sponsors. The average livestock judge's fee is around \$300.00 and the average non-livestock judge's fee is around \$150.00. Last year, the 4-H and FFA judges' fees totaled around \$5,000.

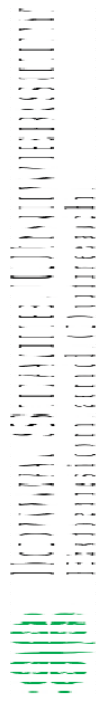
Another cost of the youth shows at the Southern Iowa Fair is premiums. Each 4-H and FFA member receives money for the ribbons they earn. Purple and blue ribbons are \$2.00 each, red ribbons are \$1.00 each, and white ribbons are \$.50 each. Last year, the premium payout for 4-H and FFA youth was just under \$3,000.

The final cost of the youth shows at the Southern Iowa Fair is awards and recognition. Trophies, banners, plaques, and ribbons are awarded to those who do very well in their fair classes. These materials are purchased early and locally to save on the cost but still end up costing quite a bit. The awards and recognition items have been paid for by local sponsors in the past. We are no longer asking for specific trophy donors, but are asking for 4-H and FFA Youth Show Sponsors. Last year, we spent over \$5,500 on trophies, plaques, banners, and ribbons.

We have set up sponsorship levels for the 4-H and FFA Youth Shows Fund and the levels are as follows:

- Platinum—\$1000.00 and above**
- Gold—\$500.00-\$999.00**
- Silver—\$250.00-\$499.00**
- Bronze—\$125.00-\$249.00**
- Contributing—\$75.00-\$124.00**

Each sponsor will be listed on the 4-H and FFA Youth Show Sponsors board at the Southern Iowa Fair (outside of the sale ring near the Pavilion), on posters that will be posted around the fairgrounds, on 4-H and Extension ads leading up to and following the fair, on show orders at the fair, and will be announced during the 4-H and FFA livestock shows. Recognition can be guaranteed if donations are received at the Extension office by **Friday, June 14, 2019.**
