YQCA for Livestock Exhibitors

We are now using YQCA (Youth for the Quality Care of Animals) for all livestock exhibitors—**4-H & FFA**.

WE WILL NOT OFFER AN IN-PERSON FSQA/YQCA TRAINING.

Those who are certified for the FSQA Test are good until the current test certification expires. Once that date expires, exhibitors must complete YQCA online. YQCA is an online training that can be completed at home or at the Extension office (by appointment). Cost to take the online training is \$12.00 each year. Those who complete a financial aid application at the Extension office will automatically receive a coupon code to use.

YQCA must be completed by **JULY 1** for members to be eligible to exhibit livestock at the county and/or state fair. The YQCA online program includes three components for each topic (food safety, animal well-being, and character development): 1) knowledge building, 2) skills lab, 3) quiz for each content topic, and are designed specifically for each age group. The online program is very interactive, bright, colorful, relatable, and fun! More information can be found at <http://yqca.org/about/curriculum>.

Mahaska County Code of Conduct

Every 4-H member in Mahaska County is required to complete the Mahaska County 4-H Code of Good Conduct form one time. Re-enrolling members have their forms completed. New members have until May 15, 2019 to complete their form. Forms can be completed electronically through the webform on our website at: <https://www.extension.iastate.edu/mahaska/news/mahaska-county-4-h-code-good-conduct-form>, they can be printed and mailed/dropped off, or they can be completed at the Extension office. Please note this only needs to be done ONCE EVER, not each year.

Horse Project Information

Every 4-H & FFA member who plans to exhibit horses, ponies, or mules at the 2019 Southern Iowa Fair must complete at least 1 *clinic and 2 *ride nights to gain eligibility to exhibit at the county fair.

The first Tuesday of each month, starting in April, will be a Mahaska County 4-H Horse Clinic. The third Tuesday of each month, starting in April, will be a Mahaska County 4-H Horse Ride Night. Youth must bring horses and ride for the Ride Night to count. Clinics and Ride Nights will be held at the Outdoor Arena on the Southern Iowa Fairgrounds, unless otherwise noted. Clinics and Ride Nights will begin at 6:30 p.m.

All clinics and ride nights will be open at 6:30 p.m. on the scheduled date, if no one arrives within 15 minutes, the superintendents and speakers will leave and the event will be over. *A Horse Project Facebook group has been created, please search for Mahaska County FFA & 4H Project.*

* Approved ride nights must be offered by the Mahaska County 4-H Horse Superintendents, Mahaska County Saddle Club Fun Show, or Mahaska County Saddle Club Barrel Series. Exhibitors MUST ride horses for these to count as a Ride Night. Photos of exhibitors riding at the Mahaska County Saddle Club events must be submitted to the 4-H Horse Superintendent group at the addresses above.

Bucket/Bottle Animal Birthdates

Bucket/Bottle Calves must be born between:

February 1 and April 30, 2019

Bottle Lambs & Goats must be born between:

January 1 and April 30, 2019

All bucket/bottle animals must be in the youth exhibitor's possession within **two** weeks of the animal's birth and must be bottle/bucket fed. Packets for Bucket/Bottle animals are available at the Extension office and on our website. We have recently revised the Bottle Lamb & Goat packet. All bucket/bottle animals must be identified in 4hOnline by 11:59 p.m. on **May 15, 2019**. You may identify more than one bucket/bottle animal, but may only exhibit one of each at the fair. **Bottle Lambs and Goats do not need to attend the weigh-in this year.**

Bottle Lamb & Goat Worksheets

Copies can be picked up from the Extension office or mailed to members. The revised worksheet is more “user-friendly” than in past years.

Bucket/Bottle Calf worksheets were NOT revised and are also available.

All Bucket/Bottle animal worksheets (along with 2 black & white copies) are due to the Extension office by 4:30 p.m. on **Friday, July 5th**. Late submissions will be lowered one ribbon placing.

Swine Weigh-in Details for March 23

Swine Weigh-in will be held on Saturday, March 23 from 8:00-10:00 AM in the Maintenance Shop at the Southern Iowa Fairgrounds.

4-H & FFA youth planning to exhibit at the Southern Iowa Fair are permitted to weigh-in six pigs in the spring with a maximum of three eligible to show at the county fair, see exception below. An additional six may be weighed in for the Pen of 3 class.

Pen of 3 Swine must be identified with special feeder pen tags at the spring weigh-in. Each exhibitor can weigh-in 6 pigs for this class. Exhibitors must choose 3 to bring to the fair. Pen of 3 pigs will not have ultrasounds done at fair weigh-in. Pen of 3 will be stalled in one stall, not separately. Pigs will be judged during the show by the judge on: uniformity, rate of gain, and overall quality.

Class Options for swine include, Commercial Gilt, Purebred Gilt (must have 5 to establish class and registration papers are due at fair), Market Swine, Derby Swine, and Pen of 3 Swine. The requirement of having at least one derby pig applies to all individual entries. If just exhibiting a Pen of 3 Swine, the derby requirement does not apply.

Rabbit Tattoo Clinic May 6

Anyone with rabbits that need tattooed for fair identification purposes can attend the clinic on **Monday, May 6** between 6:30-7:30 PM in the DAV Building on the Southern Iowa Fairgrounds. Adam Antolik, Rabbit Superintendent, will be present to answer questions and to tattoo rabbits. Rabbits that are already tattooed do not need to attend this clinic. Youth are not required to attend this clinic, it is just an option available to families.

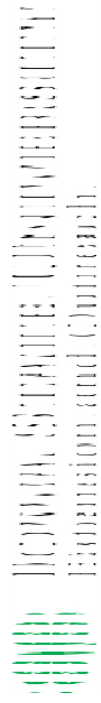
Iowa Poultry Queen
