- National 4-H Conference
 - Week-long trip to our nation's capital in spring 2024. Share your perspectives on issues relevant to youth with national leaders and congressional members.
- National 4-H Congress
 - Trip to Atlanta, GA one day after Thanksgiving through the following Tuesday. Keynote speakers, service projects and more.
- State 4-H Council
 - Year-long commitment working with state 4-H staff and planning the Iowa 4-H Youth Conference
- State Project Awards:
 - Awarded to 4-Hers who showed mastery, leadership, communication and service in a specific project area. Must be in grades 10-11 at time of application.
- State 4-H Shooting Sports Ambassador
 - Year-long commitment promoting 4-H Shooting Sports around Iowa
- ♦ Iowa 4-H Reporter Program
 - Work with professional media mentors form TV, Radio & Newspapers to develop news media during the two weeks at the Iowa State Fair.
- Iowa 4-H Healthy Living Ambassadors
 - Work as a team to bring wellness initiatives to communities across lowa. Attend Ignite summit
 in Washington DC each year. Host Healthy Living Day at the Iowa State Fair.

- Applications are now open to apply for college scholarships
- Applications are due March 1st by 11:59pm.
- Youth must have 2 letters of recommendation
 - One from Extension Staff or 4-H volunteer and one from school/college academic advisor/ teacher
- Only one application is needed for all of the Iowa 4-H scholarships
- You can apply for more than one scholarship but can only receive one per academic year!.


