## LIVESTOCK CLASSES

### Sheep & Goats

**Class J: Bottle Lamb/Sheep** – Any breed.

SHOW DATE:

**Saturday, July 23rd 1:30 PM**

CHECK IN:

**Saturday, July 23rd 1:15 PM**

**Clover Kids may bring 1 Sheep or bottle lamb**

**Sheep must be born after March 1, 2021.**

- ⇒ Clover Kids will show the audience the animal and talk to a judge. Questions may include: name, type of animal, what it eats, favorite thing about it, etc.
- ⇒ All participants will receive a Clover Kids ribbon..
- ⇒ All sheep are to remain on a halter at all times.

**Note: All animal projects MUST arrive at Check-In time and be taken home following the Clover Kids show.**

## STATIC CLASSES



Each Clover Kid are encouraged to bring projects. Exhibits should fit in one of the classes below.

**Class A: Creative Arts** – Showcase items related to art, photography, and music.

*Examples: Painting, Framed Picture, Craft, etc.*

**Class B: Agriculture and Natural Resources** – Showcase items related to plants, agriculture, and the environment. Notice: Due to the risk of bringing live plants to the county fair, you will be responsible for the care of your plant(s) while they are at the fair.

*Examples: Potted Plant, Vegetables, etc.*

**Class C: Family and Consumer Science** – Showcase items related to food, clothing, or home decorating. Sewn or home-crafted items can be included in this class.

*Examples: Plated Cookies, Tie Blanket, etc.*

**Class D: Personal Development** – Showcase items related to or created by the child

*Examples: Homemade Story Book, Growth Chart, Poem etc.*

**Class E: Science, Engineering, and Technology** – Showcase items related to science, engineering, technology, or items designed and built by the child, such as wood items.

*Examples: Lego Creation, Spaghetti Tower, etc.*

**Class F: Other** – Showcase items not included under any of the above classes.

**Class L: Tie-Dye Throw Down** – Special Tie-Dye T-Shirt competition. Contact your local extension office for more details! (Deadline to register is Jun 1)

**Class M: Animal Science**—Showcase items related to animals and your involvement with them!

## SMALL ANIMAL CLASSES

### Rabbit

**Class G: Rabbit** – Any gender, age, or breed.

**Friday, July 22nd 1:45 PM**



**Clover Kids may bring 1 Rabbit.**

- ⇒ Clover Kids will show the audience the rabbit and talk to a judge. Questions may include: name, type of rabbit, what does the rabbit eat, what is your favorite thing about rabbits, etc.
- ⇒ All participants will receive a Clover Kids ribbon.

### Poultry

**Class H: Poultry** – Any gender, age, or breed of chicken, duck, or other fowl.

**Thursday, July 21st 1:30PM PM**

CHECK IN:

**Thursday, July 21st 1:15 PM**



**Clover Kids may bring 1 Poultry Animal.**

- ⇒ Clover Kids will show the audience the bird and talk to a judge. Questions may include: name, type of bird, what it eats, what is your favorite thing about it, etc.
- ⇒ All participants will receive a Clover Kids ribbon.

## ANIMAL CLASSES

### Pet Show

**Class I: Pet** – Any gender, age, or breed.

SHOW DATE:

**Thursday, July 21st 12:30 PM (Directly to the east of the 4-H Exhibit Building)**

CHECK IN:

**12:15 PM at the 4-H Exhibit Building**



**Clover Kids may bring 1 Pet.**

- ⇒ Clover Kids will have the opportunity to show the audience their pet and tell a caring adult about their pet.
- ⇒ Pets include cats, gerbils, guinea pigs, hamsters, mice, turtles, birds, dogs, and other small pets. Cats & dogs must have a current rabies certificate and bring it to the Pet Show Check In.
- ⇒ All pets should arrive on a leash, in a crate, cage, or bowl.
- ⇒ All exhibitors are responsible for their pet and any messes it makes.
- ⇒ No wild animals are allowed.
- ⇒ Please do not bring aggressive or skittish animals.
- ⇒ All participants will receive a Clover Kids ribbon.
