Many counties in lowa have endowment funds that are used specifically to support 4-H'ers in their respective counties, and those funds are overseen and managed by Endowment Committees. We are excited to announce that Polk County now has an endowment fund and a newly established committee as well! We wanted to take this opportunity to introduce ourselves and answer some questions you may have.

What is the mission of the committee?

"The Polk County 4-H Endowment Committee exists to raise and manage funds for the sustainability of the Polk County 4-H Endowment with the goal of enriching the lives of current and future 4-H'ers".

Who is on the committee?

Brenda Gill, Angie Hilbert, Barb Lykins, Jeff Murphy, Adam Obrecht, Emma Runde, & Jennifer Weaver. Bridget Johnson is our County Council representative, and Megan Freel and Paul Gibbins are our county representatives.

How long has the committee been in existence?

The committee was formed in January 2023. The members of the committee will serve 1-3 year terms, and we will fill roles as committee members complete their terms.

For what type of initiatives will the funds raised by this committee be used?

The committee has a lot of ideas, but some are: Covering most (if not all) of the yearly enrollment fees; Provide scholarships to enable clubbers to attend state and national 4-H councils; Provide college scholarships; Provide resources to County 4-H staff to recruit and serve current and future 4-H'ers. This is not an exhaustive list!

Does the money stay in Polk County?

YES! Many other counties have their own endowment funds to help grow and serve their local 4-H clubs, and we are excited to do the same! The committee has already provided funds to purchase new signs to designate the Polk County livestock areas at the lowa State Fair this year, and we look forward to funding more things like this for Polk County 4-H.

We have some starter funds from gifts, but we need to grow the endowment and need your help! You can help by:




