#### **Enrollment 2.0 is OPEN!**

4-H Online enrollment is live for the 2023-2024 program year! To access the website, visit 4-H Online 2.0, and use the same email and password as last year. Youth in 4-H (4th-12th grade) are \$50 and youth in Clover Kids (K-3rd grade) are \$5. Financial assistance is available to anyone who may need it through the <a href="Lowa 4-H Foundation">Lowa 4-H Foundation</a>. You can also find a <a href="help sheet">help sheet</a> located on the lowa 4-H page to assist you with the registration process. Remember, 4-H members must be enrolled in order to participate in Polk County 4-H programs. While the deadline is May 15, youth are not covered under our insurance until they are enrolled and approved in 4-H Online.

#### Iowa Farm Bureau Scholarships

The Iowa Farm Bureau Federation (IFBF) and many of its 100 county Farm Bureaus offer a variety of scholarships at the state and local level to high school seniors accepted into an accredited institution of higher education (i.e. Technical College, Junior College, Community College, College or University).

To apply for these scholarships, <u>you only need to submit one application</u>, which will enter you for a chance to receive the state and local Farm Bureau scholarships available to you. Eligibility for all Farm Bureau scholarships is reserved for current IFBF members (and their children) who are in good standing with the organization. To become a member, it is a \$35 membership fee. To be considered, a graduating high school senior must have a minimum 2.5 grade point average (GPA), be involved in extra-curricular activities, and be accepted into an accredited higher education institution (including community colleges and technical schools).

#### Weigh-in and Tagging Dates

Please mark your calendars with the following weigh-in date:

- Swine tagging Saturday, April 20, 2024 from 8:00 am-11:00 am at the Iowa State Fair Grounds Sheep Barn
- Sheep and Goat Saturday, April 27, 2024 from 8:00 am-12:00 am at the Iowa State Fair Grounds Sheep Barn

Beef, and sheep may be weighed-in in any county as the processes are very similar. If you choose to attend another county's weigh-in, please coordinate this in advance with <u>Marci</u> or 515-957-9770. Swine for the Polk County Fair <u>MUST</u> be tagged in on our date due to varying county processes. Goats must also be ID at the Polk County Fair weigh-in date.

#### Youth For The Quality Care Of Animals (YQCA)

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) formally FSQA. **EVERYONE'S** certification will expire before fair!

This is a required certification for all youth who exhibit the following animals at the county or state fair. Certification needs to be completed by July 1.

- Cattle- Breeding, Market & Dairy
- Swine- Breeding & Market
- Sheep- Breeding & Market
- · Goats- Breeding, Market & Dairy
- Poultry
- Rabbits

Below are the options for training for the 2024 fair Season.

- Online YQCA class option for all age levels (Certification is good for 1 year)
  - Please note that the online option will cost you \$12/youth- Payable online only

- Youth will have 3 quizzes that they will need to pass with an 80% above. If youth do not pass a quiz they will be locked out for 1 hour and then have an opportunity to pass again without paying additional fees. This can be done as many times as necessary.
- Face to Face class options: (Certification is good for 1 year)
  - Please note that the Face to Face option will cost you \$3/youth- Payable online only
    - Pre-registration is required via <a href="https://yqcaprogram.org/login/index.php">https://yqcaprogram.org/login/index.php</a>
    - There is a pre-test and a post test that youth will need to complete to get their certificate
