Youth For The Quality Care Of Animals (YQCA)

Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) formally FSQA.

EVERYONES Certification will expire before fair! This is a required certification for all youth who exhibit the following animals at the county or state fair. **Certification needs to be completed by July 1**.

- Cattle- Breeding, Market & Dairy
- Swine- Breeding & Market
- Sheep- Breeding & Market
- Goats- Breeding, Market & Dairy
- Poultry
- Rabbits

Below are the options for training for the 2023 fair Season.

- Online YQCA class option for all age levels (Certification is good for 1 year)
 - Please note that the online option will cost you \$12/youth- Payable online only
 - https://yqcaprogram.org/
 - Youth will have 3 quizzes that they will need to pass with an 80% above. If youth do not pass a quiz they will be locked out for 1 hr and then have an opportunity to pass again without paying additional fees. This can be done as many times as necessary.
- Face to Face class options: (Certification is good for 1 year)
 - Please note that the Face to Face option will cost you \$3/youth- Payable online only

Swine tagging – Saturday, April 15, 2023 from 8:00 am-11:00 am at the Iowa State Fair Grounds Sheep Barn

Sheep and Goat – Saturday, April 29, 2023 from 8:00 am-11:00 am at the Iowa State Fair Grounds Sheep Barn

4-H Club Enrollment Incentive

We are offering an incentive to re-enrolling clubs that have 90% or more of their club "Active" by December 15.

- 1. What does "active" mean? An active 4-H member has enrolled in 4-H Online and paid their \$40 fee.
- 2. **How are percentages determined?** 4-H Online tells us who is active, inactive, and pending as well as a total for each club (inactive numbers and the totals are based upon 4-H enrollment from the 2020-2021 4-H year). We then divide the number of active members by the total.

Example: Club A | Active 10, Pending 8, Inactive 5, Total 23.

- 43.4% of the club has been enrolled
- The math: 10/23 = .434 = 43.4%
- Club A does not meet the incentive. If Club A's leader knows that members are not returning, the leader needs to email Megan with their names.

What is the incentive? This year the incentive is \$40 added to their club account.

Leader Turnover and New Volunteers

If your club is experiencing leader turnover or welcoming new leaders to assist the club, please be sure to follow the **required** onboarding process. Clubs that fail to follow the process below will be placed in provisional status. Contact Megan as soon as there is knowledge of new and/or additional leaders. New volunteers must:

- Complete and successfully pass background check
- · Meet with Megan for a volunteer interview
- Watch volunteer training videos in 4-H online
- Attend new volunteer training

Returning leaders and volunteers must complete annual volunteer training on 4-H Online. Contact **Megan** or **Marci** with questions.
