November 19 | Crop Marketing

Crop marketing can be challenging. During this session, participants will get a general overview to crop marketing and be able to explain different crop marketing tools and strategies and define the terminology that gets used with crop marketing.

December 17 | Farming for bushels or profitability?

Balancing the agronomics with the economics. The highest yield does not always equal the most profitable. This session will focus on looking at return on investments (ROI) and how to use and apply research results to make decisions to get the best ROI for your farming operation.

January 14 | Profitability & considerations for growing alternative crops in IA– Is a change the answer?

Have you considered making a change to your operation but don't know where to start? This session will share results of economic returns from 3- and 4-year crop rotations with facilitated discussion on the finer points to consider in adding, removing, or modifying a farm enterprise as well as how to plan ahead to avoid foreseeable pitfalls in the process.

February 18 | Growing Season Weather Outlooks and Weather Resources

What will the 2020 growing season bring? State Climatologist Justin Glisan will provide a growing season weather outlook. He will also share some useful weather resources and tools that we can use on our own.

March 17 | Planning for Successful Implementation of a Herbicide Program Resources

What makes a herbicide program successful? This session will share beginning-level insight and resources for developing a strong herbicide program, as well as the important (and often forgotten) follow through necessary to make it work!

April 7 | Early Season Scouting Tips and Tricks

With the growing season right around the corner, join us for a session focusing on early season scouting tips and tricks. We will share resources on common early season pests and issues.
