#### **Pioneer Seed Grant**

The Pioneer Seed Grant is meant to inspire local 4-H clubs to plan and carry out **community improvement** activities. If you and your club have a **community service** project in mind and would like some financial support to make that happen, here is your chance!



Pioneer will provide up to \$5,000 to selected 4-H clubs in Iowa. Awards will be made directly to the clubs through the Iowa 4-H Foundation from Pioneer as soon as selections are made. Grants will range from a minimum of \$50 to a maximum of \$500.

#### Statewide 4-H Home Improvement Workshop

The State 4-H Home Improvement Team is looking forward to offering a trio of statewide, virtual 4-H project workshops in the home improvement project area!

#### **Topics:**

January 18, 2024 from 5-6pm:

- Furniture Design and Creating a Scale Model

March 28, 2024 from 5-6pm:

- Furniture Finishes and Techniques for Finishing or Refinishing Home Improvement or Woodworking Projects

May 2, 2024 from 5-6pm:

- Creating Floor Plans and Exploring Accessibility in Floor Plans

4-H Members (4th-12th grade) across the state can view and register for events in their 4-H online profile. The cost to attend is free, but space is limited as we will be providing each participant with a kit to support their workshop experience.

### Citizenship Washington Focus

Citizenship Washington Focus is a 4-H leadership and civic engagement program for high school youth (who completed grades 9-12 at the time of the trip). Each summer teens gather in Washington DC to learn what it means to be a strong leader in their community, country, and world.

Tentative Trip Dates: June 13-23, 2024

Estimated Trip Cost: \$3,000 (Includes lodging, travel, tours, and meals. Scholarships/financial assistance available





#### **Trip Objectives:**

- Strengthen communication, leadership, and other citizenship skills on a national level
- Understand the importance of civic and social responsibilities as they relate to the development of better citizens and leaders
- Exchange ideas, practice respect, and form friendships with other youth from diverse backgrounds
- Experience hands on learning using the historical backdrop of our nation's capital city, Washington DC



### States' 4-H Exchange - Host Family Recruitment

Have you ever wanted to experience different cultures but do not have upcoming plans to travel to a different country? Don't miss out on the opportunity to host a Japanese youth!

The <u>States' 4-H Exchange International Program</u> seeks lowa families to host a Japanese exchange student (ages 12-17) or an adult chaperone for 3.5 weeks this summer. This is a great opportunity to assist these students in experiencing American culture while also experiencing Japanese culture yourself.



Families do not need to be involved in the Iowa 4-H program to host. Families who would like to host a youth should have a child in the home between the ages of 11-17 as host families will be paired with a Japanese child of the same gender and within 3+ years of age.

The deadline to apply is April 15, 2024. Japanese youth delegates will be assigned to a host family by June 1,
