#### Welcoming a New 4-H Year

Each year, all new and returning 4-H and Clover Kids must enroll via <u>4-H Online (4honline.com)</u> and pay a registration fee to become an official 4-H or Clover Kid member

Membership Dues are as follows:

- Community 4-H Club: \$35

- Community Clover Kids Club: \$5

- After-School Clover Kids: \$40

This year, all across Iowa 4-H membership dues rose \$5. However, in Poweshiek County the 4-H membership dues will NOT increase. A huge thank you to Glen and Ginger Sterk who have graciously offered to cover the \$5 increase for every Poweshiek County 4-H and Clover Kid youth this year!

Re-enrollment must be completed by December 15th, 2023 to continue receiving 4-H information. Reminder that you are not fully enrolled until we receive payment. When registering be sure to indicate which projects you are interested in so that you receive any information pertaining to that project area.

#### **Record Books and Project Awards**

Record keeping is an important life skill that can be used in our every day lives. It is an ongoing life skill that a 4-H member can use after their 4-H years end. This process allows members to get hands on experience with record keeping, and it allows them to accurately keep their track of their participation, goals, achievements, and reflections. Members are encouraged to use their record books to look back on their 4-H career throughout the years.

Below is a guide for how to start your record books!

#### **Title Page**

Include your name, age, grade last completed, club, number of years you have been in 4-H and a photo of yourself.

#### **4-H Yearly Summary**

Click <u>here</u> for the 4-H Yearly Summary form. This is your opportunity to showcase everything you have done throughout the year. You should have one every 4-H year you have completed, starting with the most recent year. Please remember, this is more than just your County Fair exhibits! Did you do a presentation at your club? Attend a workshop? Etc.

#### **Project Records and Awards**

If you would like to apply for a project award, you must complete a Static Project Area Form or a Livestock Project Record Sheet (1 form per species). All forms and record sheets can be found on <u>our website</u> under the Record Keeping section.

There will be \$10- \$15 dollar premium for record books that meet certain criteria Record Books will be due Friday, October 20th to the Extension Office!

#### Outside Cover & Title Page: Introducing yourself

- -Outside cover: Name and club
- -Title page: Name, Age, Grade Completed, Club, & Picture



#### Yearly Summary: "Overall" record of what you did in 4-H This Year

- -Page 1: List of everything you have done this year
  - Ex: Attending meetings, workshops, and camps
- -Page 2: List of everything you have done this year outside of 4-H
  - Ex: At your home, in school, and in your community
- -Page 3: List of all the projects you are completing full records on. Second half of the page, is all the other projects you have been doing, just not applying for a complete record project award
- -Page 4: A story of how this past year went
  - Ex: How you felt, what you enjoyed, what you want to do next year, etc.
- -Additional: Add photos and newspaper clippings that show's your club and project involvement.



#### Project Records: Individual project areas

- -Beginning of the year goals
- -During the year: Action plan: everything you did with the project
- -What did you learn?
- -Communication: Did you do a presentation or share your knowledge?
- -End of year reflections: Overall experience, plan to continue next year?
- -Livestock/photography/horticulture forms: Species specific forms
- -Supporting materials: pictures(labeled), write-ups, newspaper clippings

The Junior Master Gardener Program received the Grand Champion purple ribbon for their county vegetable platter of cucumbers, onions, peppers, squash, and tomatoes grown on their plot at the Poweshiek County Fairgrounds. Club members Carleigh Klein; Rosie Leasure; Hanna and Slane McCue; and Cora, Grace, and William Schalmo also received numerous Grand Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons for their herbs and vegetables. In addition, William Schalmo (fifth) and Grace Schalmo (ninth) were recognized as top individual junior gardeners in the state. Klein and Hanna McCue also earned recognition as first-year exhibitors.
