Information	Program Description
Kindergarten-3rd Grade	Art-Lit TO GO! is an innovative lowa 4-H program that supports the development of art and literacy skills. This informal education program is designed to teach students a basic understanding of the foundational art elements through integrated art-literacy activities. In addition, this research-based program is designed to support the National Core Art Standards and the Common Core English Language Arts Standards.
Curriculum Format	Each lesson can be presented in 45-60 minutes. Teaching Guide with complete instructions is provided. Teaching Kit with materials needed to present lessons is provided. User may need to provide standard classroom supplies (pencils, scissors, glue). If a lesson requires perishable items (e.g. milk), user is responsible for these purchases.

Lesson	Overview
One: Mistake to Masterpieces	Students learn that mistakes are a part of the creative process and that they can grow and learn from mistakes. Students create bookmarks and change "mistake" pieces of paper into masterpieces.
Two: Lines on Signs	Students learn about lines as they work together to plan, design and create a road mural.
Three: Shape-o-saurus	Students learn about shapes and use shapes to create artwork.
Four: Color Creation	Students learn about color theory by identifying primary and secondary colors through color mixing activities.
Five: Stunning Sculptures	Students learn about sculptures and create 3-D works of art by shaping or combining materials.
Six: Touch-and-Feel Texture	Students learn about texture through exploring textures and creating a touch-and-feel book.
Seven: Lots of Layers	Students learn about collages by creating a paper pizza collage.
